Payments may be made only after the VA re ceives a certificate of attendance submitted by the veteran at the end of each month he is in attendance.

Coker cautioned that students reporting for school this fall should have sufficient fund in addition to enroll ment costs to support themselves for at least two months, since it takes approximately that long before the firt VA cleck may be issued. Stu-dents should be prepared also to supplement educational allowance payments, as nor mally these payments will not be sufficient to cover all of their educational expenses
