

## At Eastland **County Meet**


Twenty-nine members of the Petroleums and Chemicals Committee of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce met Monday at Lone Cedar Country Club for an "ideas and planning" session, and adopted a resolution pledging cooperation between the WTCC and the industries in attempting to solve the water pollution problems in West Texas. The Eastland County meet ing was one of several called by WTCC President John Ben Sheppard, who attended, as did Dr. Joe Nelson, vice president, from Weatherford.

Another goal set by the committee comprised mostly of chemical and petroleum company executives is to improve the public image of industries as a whole. "Criticism is too often leveled at, all members of our industries every time 'pollution' is mentioned," one member said "and it's not true, even though there are some who are guilty of practices contributing to pollution."






