## Mrs. Foster, Civic Leaguers Work Hard for Eastland

On May 11, 1966, Mrs. John Foster was installed as the 24th president of Eastland Civic League and Garden Club, organized in 1917.

The Club's constitution states that "The object of the Civic League and Garden Club shall be to encourage and advance the public good of Eastland through the efforts of the club as a body and as individuals of said club."

Through the years, the Club has lived up to this purpose in many ways.

Eastland Memorial Hospital had its beginning in Civic League, which spearheaded the drive for funds with a \$3,000 contribution. Members worked daily during the actual construction, furnishing food and coffee to the men who worked. In 1957, the League purchased a hyperdermic and needle sterilizer for the hospital. The League also honors the nursing profession annually by

presenting the LVN graduates to the public at a tea the week of their graduation exercises.

Members of the League have worked with city officials on additional safety signs on streets near schools, an adequate sewerage system for homes north of the river, and street signs and correctly numbered houses.

It was the Civic League who started the drive for a memorial plaque honoring the 143 men from Eastland County who lost their lives in World War II and the Korean Conflict. On May 29, 1961, the Texas Legislature passed a Resolution recognizing the "noble and patriotic" service of League members, in honoring these men.

Civic League sponsored the mass vaccination against polio.

They hold an annual Spring Clean-up campaign & Christmas Decorating Contest.

The League has been responsible for many fine movies and noted speakers being brought to Eastland. Eastland Civic Theater was launched by the League in 1965, when "An Evening of One-Acts" was presented at the Elementary School Cafeteria.

Throughout the years, the League has carried out a beautification program for Eastland. Flower bulbs have been distributed (more than five thousand in one year alone), the planter boxes around the square were built and are maintained, and many trees have been planted.

Mrs. Foster moved here in August of 1963, when her husband, John, became Eastland High School band director. They live with their son, three year old Danny, at 508 Pershing.

Members of the Church of Christ, both John and Tommy are active in religious work. John shares her enthusiasm for civic work.

A native of Crosbyton, Mrs. Foster graduated from Crosbyton High School and attended Abilene Christian College, where she met John, a student from Brownsboro. Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. T. R. Pennington, still live in Crosbyton, near Lubbock.

Mrs. Foster likes cooking, gardening and sewing, especially dainty work. She is currently doing sequin and bead work and has just completed a Christmas stocking in suede cloth, with colored sequins.

One of her beaded velveteen Christmas stockings has been awarded third place in the Needlework Division of the 1966 West Texas Fair, now in progress in Abilene.
