FIVE TEXAS PROJECTS APPROVED BY SECRETARY ICKES

Texas is not being overlooked by the New Deal administration. Five non-federal public works projects were given approval by Harold L. Ickes, secretary of the department of the interior and CWA administrator. Corpus Christi was given a loan and grant aggregating \$200,000 to navigation district number one for construction of a ship canal and a new turning basin with a protective earth levee at the south side of Nueces bay.

A loan and grant of \$400,000 was made to the city of Austin for a project backed by the municipal authorities which will provide 125 jobs for seven months. Rosenberg was given a loan and grant for \$35,000 for extensions to existing water distribution system as well as extensions to sewage collection system.

MORE THAN THREE BILLION IN CREDIT CHANNELS

More than \$3,500,000,000 has been poured into the nation's credit arteries in one way or another by the Reconstruction Finance corporation to bring about stabilization of all industries' return of solid confidence based on stability of all concerns, a restoration of the purchasing power of the masses and to guard against human suffering in the winter that it now on.

Slot Machine Raid Nets Only 15 Cents

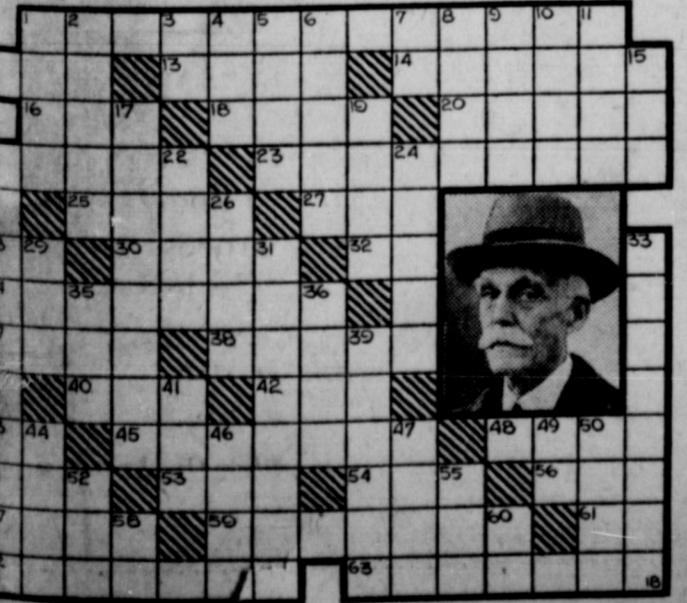
