### Paper Packs Punch, Two Sororities Say

Wondering what to do with those old magazines and papers? The two local chapters of Beta Sigma Phi have solved your problem.

A box has been placed on the square for deposit of magazines and newspapers. All proceeds from the sale of the paper will go to the Southwestern Diabetic Foundation, at Camp Sweeney, Gainesville, the only recreational and medical center in the Southwest and the largest in the world.

Louis S. Witte, public relations man, said in a letter to the sorority, "The actual non-profit, tax deductible cost of a child living at Camp Sweeney for four weeks is \$250 and of the more than 1200 who have lived there, 80 percent of the parents were unable to pay this cost, which means, without grants or endowment the continuance and furtherance of our work is wholly dependent upon public donations. No other funds are available and this is the only appeal for diabetic children. We need badly, and are now working toward the building of a non-denominational chapel."

"Instead of throwing your magazines and paper in the trash can, why not take them to the box provided for them," a spokesman urged. "They may help some diabetic child live longer."

State liquor control board men and the Ranger city police swooped down upon an alleged bootlegger Wednesday at about 11:45 a.m.

Will Cook, negro, 209 Marston street, was arrested when the law enforcement officers seized 25 half-pints of whiskey and a quantity of beer on his premises.

Cook was filed on in Justice of Peace Jim Bogus' court and bond was set at \$500. The accused made bond and denied the alleged bootlegging, stating that it was in his possession for personal use. Cook stated that he would plead "not guilty."

Eastland county voters, along with other Texans, will decide on nine constitutional amendments in the November general election. So that citizens will have a chance to study the proposals, they are printed below:

H.J.R. No. 9 — DENIAL OF BAIL. Allows judges to deny bail to professional criminals. A judge may keep a person charged with a felony (less than capital) in jail without bond if he has been convicted of two previous felonies. However, if the defendant is not brought to trial within 60 days, the judge's order is automatically set aside.

H.J.R. No. 11—No person shall be committed as a person with unsound mind except on competent medical or psychiatric testimony. It allows waiver of trial by jury in cases other than those involving a criminal offense.

H.J.R. No. 15—RELATING TO COLLEGE FINANCES. This proposal has a threefold purpose: A. Providing a method of payment for the construction of buildings at twelve named State institutions of higher learning by relieving the ad valorem tax of 5c on \$100 valuation.

B. Provides new building funds for the University of Texas and Texas A&M College and their branches. These funds would come from building bonds which may be levied against the permanent fund income.

C. Allows the Board of Regents of the University to buy listed stocks and first lien mortgages guaranteed by the government in addition to government bonds.

H.J.R. No. 23 — COUNTY FINANCES. Allows the Commissioners Courts to allocate money from the 80c per \$100 tax levy to fit the needs of the four constitutional purposes (general fund, permanent improvement fund, road and bridge fund, and jury fund). The amount allocated for each fund will be set by the court for one taxable year.

H.J.R. No. 30 — WELFARE ASSISTANCE. Provides for financial assistance to persons totally disabled, either physically or mentally, who are not presently receiving help from other welfare programs. The maximum the State can pay would be \$20 per person, and may never exceed the amount paid by the Federal Government.

H.J.R. No. 31 — FALSE IMPRISONMENT. Provides that the Legislature may grant aid and compensation to persons who have been fined and imprisoned for offenses of which they are not guilty.

H.J.R. No. 46—CHANGE IN OFFICIAL OATH. Substituting "to secure my appointment or the confirmation thereof" in lieu of "giving or withholding a vote at the election at which I was elected" in the oath of office administered to appoint officers of the State.

S.J.R. No. 2 — VETERANS LAND PROGRAM. This amendment makes a threefold change in the constitutional provision relative to the Veterans Land Program:

A. It changes the administration by relieving the Governor and Attorney General of their duties and replacing them with appointees familiar with veterans affairs and finances. The three members would be under bond, and the land commissioner would continue on as chairman of the Board.

### EASTLAND STAR EXPECTED TO LEAD RANGER JC IN OPENER

RANGER — J. D. Hanson, former Eastland High School star, is expected to lead a fleet of Ranger Junior College backs, when the Rangers take on powerful Paris Junior College in their season opener Saturday in Breckenridge.

Hanson, who was a one man track team at RJC last year, will weigh in at 172, and will be the fastest man on the team.

In the line will be veterans Eddie Jo James, Jim Mangum, Teddy Henderson, Buddy Hightower, Dan Mitchell, Don Mitchell and Loyd Truenbach, supported by new performers Charles Smith, Gene Ashcraft, Lionel Crisp, Bo Nickelson, Robert James, Butch Kalenic and Bud Remynse.

Assisting veteran Ranger backs, Lonnie Wood, Snag Hanson, Jack Rutledge, Harold McCurry, Ronald Darnell, Don Davis, and John Butler will be Douglas Jordan, Shorty McLearn, Gerald Dunn, Franklin Sims, Billy Beebe, Lawrence Claton, Tommy Sutton, Joe Karkoska, and Jodie Beal.

Game time is eight o'clock under the sponsorship of the Breckenridge American legion and the Quarterback club.

Not only does the game promise to be a thriller, but it will be the first performance of the 1956 Rangers and RJC band under the direction of Al Lotspeich.

Eastland's Mavericks will be out to hand Coach Carrol Shelton "the perfect birthday present" Friday when they invade the stronghold of the Dublin Lions in a non-district gridiron game.

Friday is Shelton's birthday, and that plus the fact that the Lions are arch rivals gives Eastland plenty to think about.

There was both good and bad news from the Maverick camp this week as the locals whipped into shape for the Dublin game. The bad news was that Neil Pogue, who turned in a fine game against Cisco in the opener at center, will probably not see action Friday night. Pogue suffered a pulled shoulder muscle in Tuesday's workouts. The injury is not believed to be serious, but Shelton said he doubted if Pogue would be ready to play this week. Bill Upchurch was also slightly injured in practice this week, but he is expected to be in full form Friday.

The good news was that 185 pound tackle Wayne Durham would be ready for full duty this week. Durham saw only limited action against Cisco because of an injured ankle.

Dublin will likely have one starter out, too. Edward Stratton, regular starting left end, will be out with a knee injury, according to word from the Lion camp.

The Lions will be the second class double-A team Eastland has met in as many games. In stepping out of their class, the Mavs will still probably be rated a slight favorite.

Eastland will have a slight weight advantage. The starting line-up released by Dublin reveals the Lions will average 159 pounds a man, with the line averaging 162 pounds, a man and the backfield 153. Eastland's starting average will be 164 pounds a man, with the line averaging 166 pounds a man and the backfield 159.

That's providing that Pogue is out of the game and Knicky Arthur sees action. If Pogue gets to start he will bring the team average up a pound a man. In case he doesn't, Coach Shelton said he will either shift Guard Jim Phillips to center and put in Arthur, 151, or Stanley Belvins, 160, at the guard slot. One other alternative the coaching staff is considering is starting 198 pound Freddy Tucker at center. Tucker, of course, would push the Mav average way up, to 168 pounds a man, in fact.

Work on Defense

The Mavs spent all day Monday working on their defense. Tuesday they still concentrated on defense, but spent some time working on offense. Wednesday they were whipping their offensive back into game form, and were working on kick-off returns and their pass offense. Thursday the locals will suit out for their usual day-before-the-game light drills.

Shelton, in looking back at last week's game, termed the Mavs' faking as "exceptional." He had a good word for Harvey Lewis' passing and Dale Slatton's receiving, but said, "our passing was lucky."

The Mav head coach said his scouting reports revealed that Dublin has a fast squad. "We will have to pay special attention to Tommy Hooks (44)," he asserted. "They run from a straight T formation a lot," Shelton revealed, "but like to flank their full back." He said the Lions' offense was well balanced. They made a 141 yards in the air and 190 of the ground in their opener against Alvarado, he pointed out, although they lost 20-6.

"That's a lot of yardage just to make six points," the Mav mentor exclaimed.

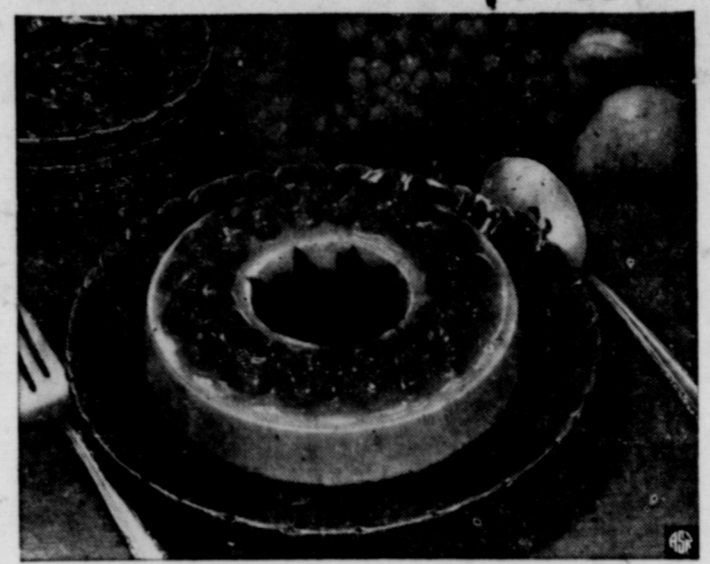

Scheduled for 9:30 a.m. Oct. 16 in the department of commerce auditorium, the hearing is open to anyone interested in the new regulations which the Coast Guard claims will affect more than 8000 party fishing motor boats, excursion sailboats and ferry barges. The proposed regulations specify requirements for lifesaving and fire-fighting equipment, the number of passengers allowed aboard and the qualifications of the crew.

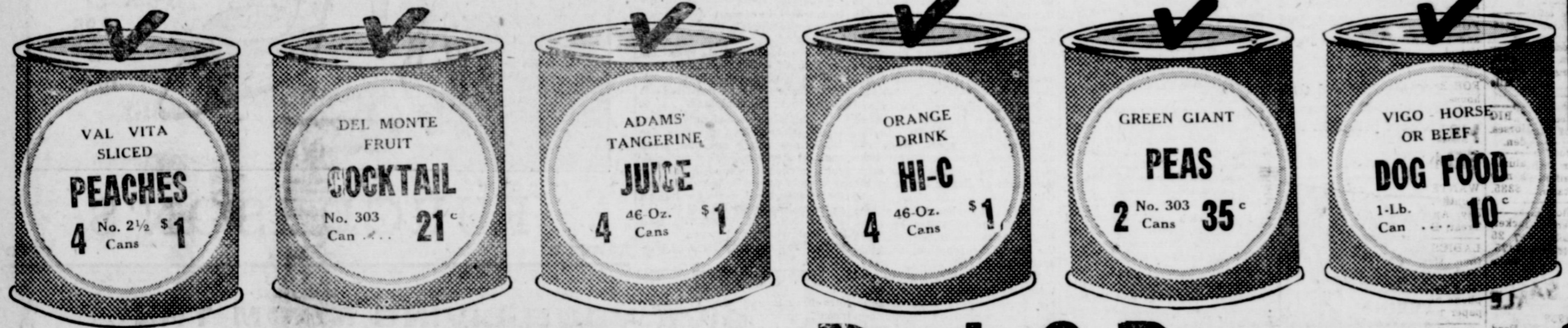

New Publication Available on Wheat Program

Clean wheat, whether shipped or stored, depends on the efforts of the producer and in many cases the warehouseman to control rodent and insect pests. A revision by the department of health, education and welfare states that "wheat will be judged contaminated if it contains one or more rodent pellets per pint of grain or if it contains 1 per cent or more insect damaged grain by weight."

It is just good business to see that wheat in storage doesn't become contaminated. Food and drug administration inspectors have been directed to sample wheat being shipped in interstate commerce and to institute seizure proceedings if the wheat inspected is found to be contaminated.

A recently released publication, L-257, clean wheat program for 1956, also points out that grain containing any poisonous material, such as chemicals used in treating seed or in rodent or insect control, may be declared unfit for human or animal consumption. No treated wheat should be mixed with food or feed wheat and such grain should be used only for seed purposes.
