





Bible Comment:

### Truth Is Fabric of Bible's Imagery

A FACT which we ought to bear in mind as we read the Bible is that it is a book of the East, with all the Eastern imagery and traditional manner of figurative

It is a mistake to interpret something which is figurative or symbolic as literal, but it is equally a mistake to imagine that the truth of the Bible is any less real because it is sometimes expressed in parables.

The woman who lost the piece of silver might have been an actual woman that Jesus had in mind, or she might have been symbolic of those who earnestly

seek and find. In the story of the prodigal son, we have all the facets concerning sin and salvation presented in the imagery of the parable. Salva-tion does not mean that the consequences of sin are entirely removed. When the prodigal sinned he suffered, and there are sins that leave indelible marks which cannot be removed.


This does not mean that sin cannot be forgiven, nor does it mean that there cannot be spir-itual restoration, though the consequences of sin often go on

and on. The great fact is that God acts toward His human children like the good father of the parable. The parable's imagery shows that when men turn from their sins, He is full of forgiveness and willingness to restore them to their rightful place.
