County Passing Chance To Be Tourist-Listed?

Eastland County has apparently rejected an opportunity to be included in a project designed to lure tourists off the super highways and into county towns.

The Texas Travel Trails Committee in Austin is preparing special maps which will list sites of unusual scenic, geologic or geographic interest, outstanding historic and archaeological sites; recreational sites; and cultural attractions. The byways will be routed over existing highways.

Major cost of establishing and publicizing the Travel Trails will be borne by the state. Each community and county participating in the program will bear the responsibility of purchasing uniform signs to designate the tour routes.

The scenic network of travel trails will be mapped by citizens and officials in the towns and counties included.

Several weeks ago, officials of the county and of each town in the county received requests for information on sites in this area which might be included on the maps. This information was to have been in Austin by Friday, June 30.

Why did Eastland County fail to send information to the committee? According to one county official, local residents simply are not interested in promoting the county as a tourist attraction.

Others gave these reasons: "Because this county is about forty-five or fifty years behind the rest of the state in promoting itself."

"No Chamber of Commerce is really interested in doing anything that involves an effort," one man declared.

"It's a big chore and no one seems interested in doing it."

"The people here fail to see any value in it."

"For the same reason nothing else around here gets done: a lack of interest and cooperation," another said.

Sites to be promoted on the Travel Trails maps will be announced by Oct. 1. After that, these sites will be marked, and the maps will be distributed.

And, as things stand now, Eastland County will not be included.

July 4 History Pageant Nearing Final Rehearsals

The big Fourth of July Pageant recreating Eastland County's history, at the Kendrick Theater Tuesday night, is shaping up nicely and final rehearsals will be held Friday and Saturday nights, it has been reported.

The show will be exciting from start to finish bringing back memories of the early days and happenings since the beginning of the county, for old-timers, and an educational look for the younger set, as to "how it used to be."

Several old settlers from different communities in the county have called and visited the production center, midway between Cisco and Eastland at the Kendrick home.

In fact many details and outlines have been adopted for this premiere production, but naturally everything can't be put into the first show. A total of 24 major events are being staged to fill out the two-hour, free show.

This show promises to be exciting from the beginning to end; as it includes things which have happened since before the Indian up until the present time; and there are few scenes in the state which have had a more picturesque history.



THE GORDON SPOT

Last week the County Agents in District 3 met at the Livestock and Forage Research Center near McGregor. The purpose of the meeting was to help keep county Agents informed on the research being conducted with beef cattle at the station.

Many interesting things were discussed such as cross breeding results, efficiency of small cows compared to large cows and performance testing.

One of the things mentioned was that we have been hearing a lot about lately is a comparison of bulls and steers as slaughter animals.

During the week of January 2, the station sold twenty animals. Ten of the animals were bulls with an average 12 months weight of 1,015 pounds and sold for \$22.62 per hundred pounds. The other ten were steers that averaged 934 pounds at 12 months and sold for \$23.22 per hundred pounds. The bulls weighed 81 pounds more, sold for 60 cents less, but brought \$12.12 more per animal.

Tests at Texas A&M indicate that you a bull beef is perfectly acc table as far as tenderness taste and "eat-ability" are concerned.

Iron chlorosis has been showing up in many lawns and ornamental plants in Eastland County. Symptoms are generally a yellowing of the green foliage due to failure of chlorophyll to develop normally.

The chorosis occurs in susceptible plants where and when iron is not available to them. This lack of iron may be due to a deficiency or to
