With farmers already conducting

With farmers already conducting preliminary skirmishes, the battle of August will soon be underway in the cotton fields of Howard county. After a survey of the fields of the county Wednesday, County Agent O. P. Griffin predicted that the fight against leaf worms would be waged on a wide front.

True to a prediction two weeks ago by the agent that the second generation of the leaf worms would begin their work between Aug. 5 and 10, the cotton fields of the county are to be subjected to their ment severe lest of the season in the next two weeks.

Mexico Likely Won't Be In A Hurry With Oil Indemnities

Precedent Set In Refusal To Arbitrate Question Of Land Seizure

MEXICO CITY, Aug. 4 (P)—The Mexican government appeared today to have established a precedent for delaying payment of indemnity in the expropriation of \$400,000,000 of American and British

owned oil properties.

Dealing with seizure of American-owned farms since Aug. 30, 1927, the government replied last night to a United States proposal for arbitration on indemnities.

The reply refused arbitration; suggested discussion to determine value of the farm land; acknowledged the debt but held there was no legal obligation to make prompt or even deferred payment; said indemnification would be under Mexican law on the basis of the nation's ability to pay; insisted that inability to pay could not be accepted as a valid reason for delaying the program of social reform by which land is being turned back to the peasantry; said flatly these reforms would be continued.

The effect of this thesis upon the 17 foreign oil firms taken over by the government March 18 was a matter for speculation, but well-informed persons believed that it would apply equally well to thet question, with little revision.

maximum, an increase in valua-tions was the board's only alternative. A proposal to allow the district to increase its tax rate to any amount up to \$1.50 was roundly defeated here last year. The valuation increase is blanket and applies to all properties.
School Situation Outlined

Accompanying the notices was a letter signed by C. W. Cunning-ham, board president, and a four page paper crammed with pertinent school facts.

Among the outstanding matters listed was the basic causes of main tenance and bonded indebtedness costs—those of constantly increas-ing enrollment, \$65,000 additional ded indebtedness, more teach-

ers, caretakers, utilities, insurance, and general upkeep expense. The district had a valuation of \$7,732,255 during the past year. Normally, collections are made on only about 85 per cent of the total roll, and using these figures, the 10 per cent valuation increase should add about \$8,000 more revenue to the school treasury. The bond requirements will mount from 30 cents of every tax dollar to 35 during the next year because of bonds voted by the people to finance a school auditorium-gym-nasium and a new elementary school building.

Those who are strictly in bondage to notes cannot fully understand or appreciate what is being played as swing."

"There must be a definite frame," she said, "and one that can be recognized, with embellishments and 'filled-in' measures for a mosphere. This, together with "zan-cut accentuation, will make good swing music, and that is all there is to it."

For the first six months of 1938 Indiana hoasts a clear slate for bank holdups. This, however, was the first time since the early 1920s that the state has not had at least one bank holdup during a six-month period.

According to state police records, there was only one bank burglary and three unsuccessful burglary attempts on state financial institutions during the first half of the current year.

Thieves obtained only approximately \$300 in a night burglary of the Burnetteville, Ind., state bank, in Cass county, on Feb. 11. On Feb. 10 and April 22 unsuccessful at-

10 and April 22 unsuccessful at-tempts were made on the Carbon, Ind., state bank and on April 24 an attempt was made on the Laps Ind., state bank.

The peak for Indiana bank rob-beries occurred in 1933 during the forays of John Dillinger and his henchmen, who extended their robberies throughout the middle west.
The Dillinger gang, all of whom are dead or in prison, is reported to have netted more than \$175,000 in wholesale state bank robberies during 1933.

In 1932 the total loss from 22 In 1932 the total loss from 22 bank holdups aggregated \$56,000, according to police records. Then came the outbreak of the Dillinger mob, which shot the losses to a new high mark in a single year. The Dillinger mobsters also operated throughout most of 1934 and aided in boosting that year's loss from bank robberies to \$61,000. There were ten raids on state banks and two messenger robberies durand two meaning the year.

Despite the daring robberies of the Brady gang in 1935, losses from bank holdups in the state were comparably small —totaling only \$10,600. Although Brady at the time of his escape from the Hancock county jail at Greenfield, Ind., boasted he would "make Dilinger look like a piker," he fell considerably below the amount of money Dillinger seized through his career of crime.

In the following year state bank robberies dropped to only \$8,000 and in 1987 fell to \$6,000, state police records show. Partly attributed to this drastic reduction was drive which gave Indiana a mo


