





It will do the commissioners no narm to suggest a new carpet and other repairs neded to make the court room a decent looking place and a more comfortable place."

The editor of the Rising Star X-Ray replied in this manner: "And jury script worth only 50c on the dollar; The X-Ray believes the commissioners court should make an effort to pay juries for service FIRST, then see after this carpet busines later. Hasn't the courtroom a good floor in it? As to that, the court could be pulled off on a dirt floor just as easily as farmers could quit their own work and business to serve on the jury for their board, and scarcely that. Carpet the script fust and the danged courtroom later."

Sev-eral out of the above number are growing very restive and rebellious at this state of affairs and are liable at any time to demand some of our preachers of our Justice of the Peace to put them in shape to work in double har-

ness to said cart.
"Esq F. W. A. Doyle of
Pioneer made us a very pleasant call Saturday. He says there has been too much rain in the last two weeks for corn on sandy land. Esq. Doyle is an old-timer in this neck of the woods, having taught school here about 25 years ago. He also served as Justice of the Peace and was a 'holy terror' to the law-breakers."
