### Census District Manager Named

Appointment of Robert C. Ford of Waco, Texas, as District Manager of the 1970 Census of Population and Housing in this area was announced today by Director Percy R. Millard of the Census Bureau's Regional Office in Dallas.

Mr. Ford is a native of Waco, Texas, and attended Baylor University.

From the District Office located at 1209 Washington St. in Waco, Mr. Ford will supervise all phases of the census in the following counties: Bell, Bosque, Brown, Callahan, Comanche, Coleman, Concho, Coryell, Eastland, Erath, Falls, Hamilton, Hood, Limestone, McLennan, Milam, Mills, Parker, Robertson, Runnels, Somervell.

On January 26, following several days of intensive training in Regional Office, Mr. Ford will come on duty and begin setting up the District Office. He will direct a force of 38 crew leaders and 568 census takers throughout the area.

Taking the 1970 Census nationally will require the services of 12,000 crew leaders, 160,000 census takers, and 393 district managers, in addition to 13,000 office personnel.

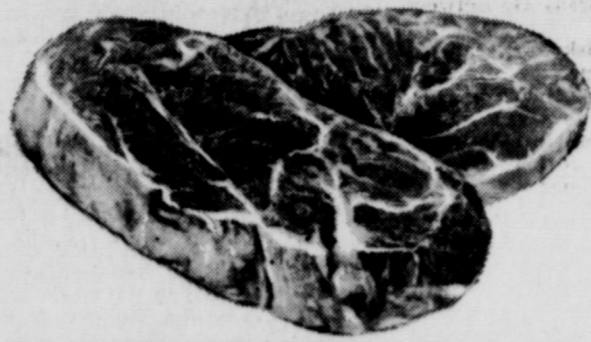
### Of Farm Bureau To Attend School

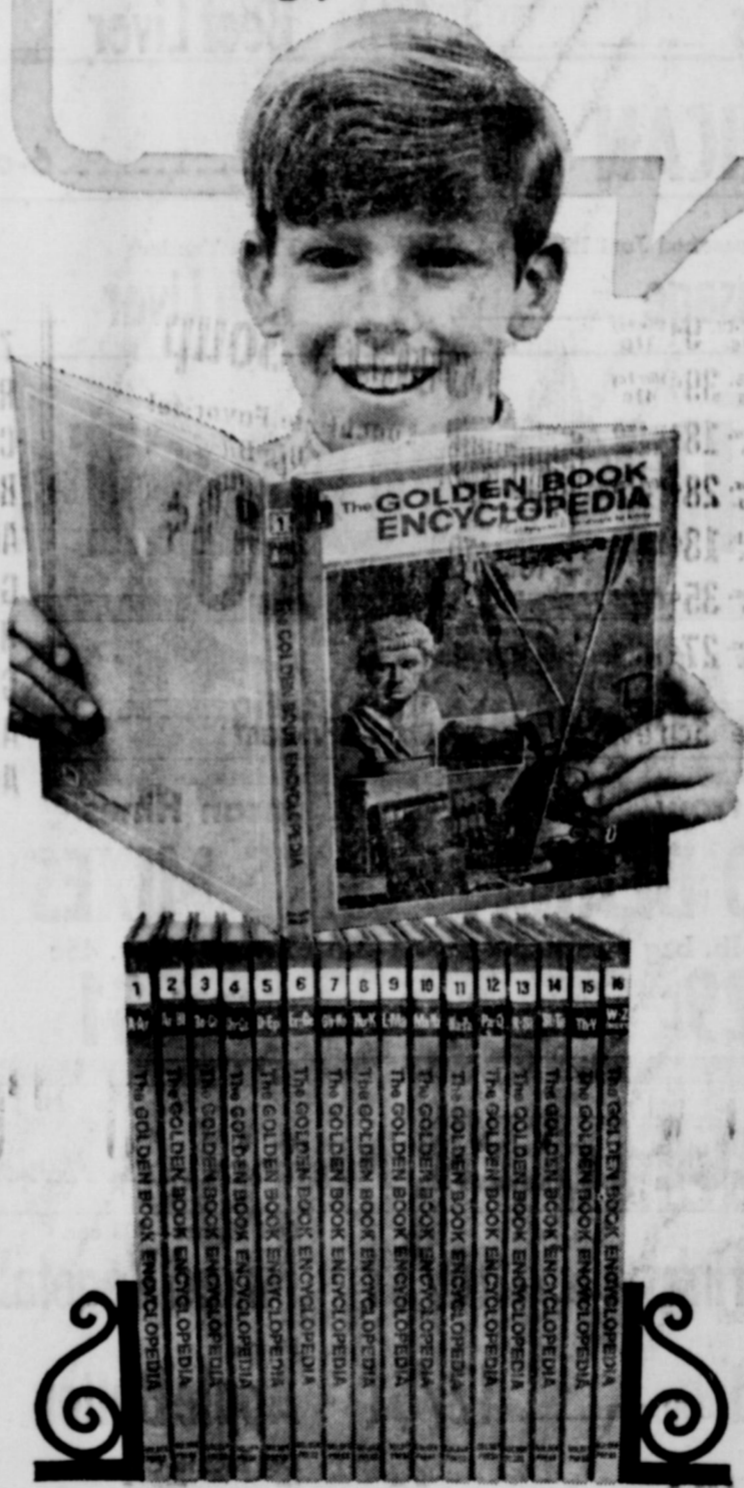
