Mr. McWhorter was born November 11, 1922 in Childress. He married Druzelia Raseo January 13, 1950 in Ft. Sumner, New Mexico and moved to Eastland eleven years ago from Amarillo. He operated the Acme Weidling Shop, west of Eastland.

He was a member of the Nazarene Church and the Men's Fellowship Bible Class of the First Christian Church.

'70 Census Doesn't Figure! But It's All We Got for Now

Like 'em or not, the preliminary census figures everybody heard by rumor for Eastland County and its towns, is the way it is — at least until they can be corrected, hopefully upward in the fall.

So far as is known, no official in the county has been formally given the 1970 census figures, as had been announced would be done, earlier. The news media came out with some figures recently for our area, but most preferred to wait for more official word.

In a telephone conversation Friday with the Regional Director for the Census Bureau this newspaper learned that the figures all point downward for the time being, even though they could be raised upward in the fall reports (manner of reporting still undetermined.)

The Regional Director gives it like this:

Eastland County: 17,527.
Cisco: 3,817.
Eastland: 3,211.
Ranger: 2,991.
Carbon: 256.
Gorman: 1,105.
Rising Star: 990.

That represents a total loss of 1,182 people from the six incorporated town in the county. Rising Star lost less than only seven fewer people than in 1960. Carbon lost 53; Cisco, 682; Eastland, 81; Gorman, 37; and Ranger, 322.

The preliminary figures indicate that Eastland County lost 1,999 people in the decade between 1960 and 1970. Estimate at mid-decade was 19,000.

If these figures be correct and aren't changed, it would appear that the rural, non-incorporated areas did better than the towns. The rural drop amounts to 817.

Most in the county agree that these figures need careful evaluation, and that a concerted effort be made to find people who were not counted. Reports are rampant of those who were not contacted to have census forms picked up. (An Eastland family with five children reports that a census taker never visited their home.)

Therefore this newspaper will join with those in other areas offering space and informs for those who report that they were not counted. The information will be forwarded to the Regional Director, for computer checking. The Waco District Office, in Eastland County was included, and the Wichita Falls office have been closed.

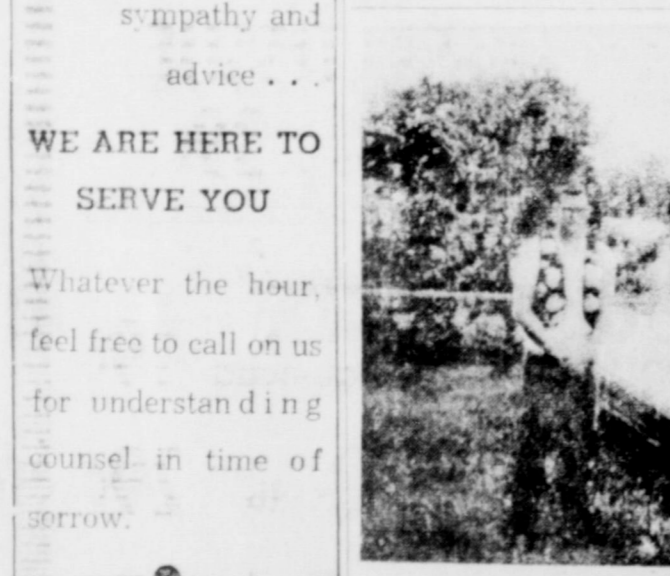

Homemakers Hints

Also, remember that egg whites beat to greatest volume at room temperature. Separate the eggs (carefully, for even a speck of yolk will cut down the volume) and return the yolk to the refrigerator. These will keep two or three days in a covered container (with water) until you can make good use of them in such dishes as French toast, scrambled eggs and puddings.

Try some of these tasty recipes.

Merry Meringue Shells
 3 eggs whites
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar
 1/2 cup sugar

Preheat oven to 250 degrees F. (very slow). Beat egg whites until foamy. Add salt and cream of tartar. Beat until soft peaks form.

Add sugar gradually, beating constantly, and continue beating until very stiff peaks form. Shape meringue into six mounds on heavy brown paper on a baking sheet. Using the back of a spoon, form a hollow in the center of each mound. Bake 1 hour. Turn off heat and let meringue cool in oven.

Serve filled with ice cream, fruit, pudding, or a combination. (Note: Add it after the sugar has been beaten into the egg whites.)

Strawberry Supreme
 Swirl a whipped meringue mixture (hard) into a pie plate and bake about an hour at 250 degrees F. Cool and fill with strawberry or vanilla ice cream. Top with fresh strawberries.

Floating Islands
 2 or 3 egg whites, as desired
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 2 tablespoons sugar for each egg white

Beat egg whites until foamy. Add salt. Add sugar gradually, beating constantly, and continue beating until stiff peaks form. Pile meringue in 5 mounds on a lightly greased baking sheet. Bake at 325 degrees F. (slow oven) 10 to 12 minutes, or until lightly browned. OR, drop mounds of meringue on simmering water. Cover and cook 12 to 15 minutes, or until set. Remove from water immediately. Pop the mounds atop servings of soft custard pudding.

Coconut Kisses
 Into a stiffly beaten meringue, fold coconut (or finely chopped walnuts or slivered almonds.) Drop by tablespoons onto a cookie sheet and bake at 250 degrees F. until firm—about 30 minutes. Makes a dainty cookie.

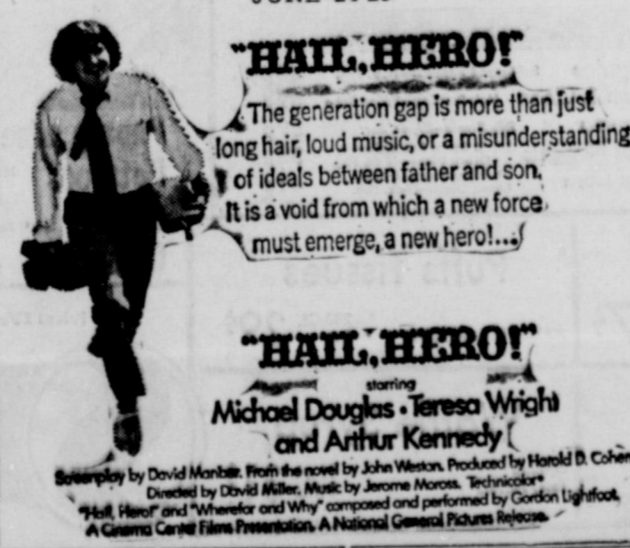
