





that in canning vegetables such as beans and peas, that it is necessary to heat vegetables before freezing to slow homeowner cannot afford to or stop the action of engumes which cause spoilage, Until vegetables are ready to pick the enzymes help them grow and mature. After that they cause loss of flavor and color. If vegetables are not heated nough, the enzymes continue to be active during food storage. The vegetables will then develop off-flavors in a few months and may discolor and toughen. Heating also wilts softens vegetables and makes them easier to pack. Too long a heating period in the blanching process will result in softening of texture and unnecessary loss of water soluable vitamins and minerals.






