

# 2 Tennessee **Aces Signed** By Wranglers

Junior College has announced the signing of two out standing backfield men from Tennessee to play with the Wrangler footballlers this

They are Doug Ivey and Steve Davis from LeFollette, Tennessee.

Ivey, a quarterback, broke nost of LaFollette High most School's passing records he passed for 1490 yards, 13 touchdowns, and a comple-tion percentage of 57%. He is 6-1 tall and weighs 178 pounds. He runs the option play well and Prescott fee that he will fit into the CJ offensive system very effe tively. Doug was voted th La Follette team's most va uable offensive player du ing the past season and w named All-Division quarte back in the Northeastern Conference of Tennessee. In Addition to his athletic prow ess Ivey was also a leader in his school, serving as stu dent body president in 1939-

Steve Davis, who is an outstanding running back and exceptional pass receiver. was selected as the most val uable player in the Northeastern Conference and was ominated on the Honorable Mention All-State team. the first nine games of the '69 season Steve had run for 1400 yards and scored points and was second on the team in pass receiving. the season finale he scored six times as Doug Ivey, the other CJC recruit from La Follette, passed for three touchdowns and 261 yards.

Coach Prescott is elated that CJC has been able to recruit the two Tennessee backfield men, and feels that they both represent extremel fine prospects for the Cisco chool's team.
