The eleven (11) mile stretch from State Highway 206 West of Cisco to Highway 6 South of Eastland is being covered with asphalt stabilized base material by Cecil Ruby Co., Inc. prior to the placing of the finished pavement.

The asphalt stabilized base operation might be completed late this fall and the finished pavement after the first of the year. Weather will affect this phase of construction and will control the time of com

In another part of the county, Cecil Ruby Co., Inc. will complete work of the Ranger by-pass section of Insterstate 20 around the 1st of July and traffic will be using this new route shortly thereafter.


