## Search Continues For Bandits Who Robbed Bank

There were no reported clues to the identity of two robbers who held up the First National Bank in Gorman last Thursday and escaped with less than \$4,000. Officers said the search was intensifying and the FBI at Dallas reported there was "lots of work to be done."

The robbers grabbed \$3,970 from the bank just before the 2 p.m. closing time Thursday, but missed the big haul when they overlooked over \$30,000 in cash boxes below the counters, Mrs. Peggy Singleton, cashier, said Friday.

Eastland County Deputy Sheriff J. D. Clements said Friday the robbery "definitely seems like a professional job. It was well planned."

He said a car found abandoned in the brush just off the Ranger highway northwest of Gorman has been identified as the robbers' car. Clements said the car was identified by a woman who said it and its occupants followed her into Gorman just before the robbery.

The car was also identified by people on the street after the robbery, he said.

through its November, 1970 payment, had contributed \$2,938.05 to its operation in Abilene. At a rate of 30 cents per capita, it pays about \$507.61 a year on its 19,507 population.

The City of Eastland, which joined in 1968, pays \$98.76 a year and had paid \$296.26 to COG prior to the current November payment.

The City of Cisco has paid a total of \$134.97 to COG. The City of Ranger has contributed \$99.39 toward its participation in the COG program.

"Goals for Texas" began in 1969 when Gov. Preston Smith initiated a thorough examination of the effectiveness of State programs and expenditures. He commissioned the major agencies of Texas State government to assist him in determining how State money is being spent, he sought an evaluation of results being obtained and he asked for a projection of future program goals and expenditures. The first phase, summarized in the publication, "Goals for Texas, Phase I," was a compilation by Texas State agencies of goals and anticipated achievements in the next two years, six years and ten years.

Goals for Texas, Phase II, followed, with the Governor asking the Regional units to seek and report citizen's goals.

4. A built-in ventilating fan, to control moisture and odors in the kitchen — perhaps also in the bath and laundry area.
5. Full Housepower Wiring, including at least 150 Amperes over-all capacity, plus plenty of branch circuits, convenience out-lets and switches.

**14 Killed So Far This Year On Rural County Highways**

There have been 14 traffic-connected deaths on Eastland County rural roads so far this year, Texas Highway Patrol Sgt. Jerry Mathews reports.

That's equal to the number killed through the month of October last year. The county was death-less this October, but one already in November brought the figure up to last year's record.

During the last two months of 1969, there were two other fatalities which boosted the year's total to 16.

In October there were six accidents in which 11 persons were injured and 13 accidents in which property damage totaled \$49,780.

October's figures brought the total for the year to 51 accidents in which 98 persons were injured, and 158 accidents in which \$218,940, damaged was reported. The 13 deaths (through September) resulted from nine accidents. (The November fatalities will be reported later.)

Eastland County leads three others in Sgt. Mathews' district in number of accidents, number killed, number injured and amount of property damage.
