

Trophies will be awarded to the first three place winners in the bands and riding clubs divisions. Judges will be representatives from each bank in the county and the judges stand will be in front of Jeannettes Fabric Shop. Also, they will provide a watchman at the show grounds both Thursday and Friday nights and will patrol the parked cars at the sales barn on Saturday night, it is reported.
