A list of candidates filing through Friday was released by Mrs. Bailey as follows: Congressman - 17th District: Omar Bursleson, residence in Jones County, attorney, age 61, re-election.

### Re-hearing Is Asked In Appeal Case Filed Here

A motion asking a re-hearing was filed Thursday in the 11th Court of Civil Appeals by Mrs. Patsy Riedel of Dallas.

The Appeals Court ruled on Jan. 19 that the trial court decision be "reversed and remanded" - holding that a new trial should be held. Mrs. Riedel's motion, filed by her Dallas law firm and Attorney Jack Frost of Eastland, asks that the new ruling be reconsidered. Monday is the deadline for filing for request for re-hearing. It was said.

The trial court awarded Mrs. Riedel \$260,780 in February of 1967 in a suit brought naming Ivan J. Allen as defendant.

The trial court decision was appealed by Allen, through his attorneys, Bill B. Hart and Virgil Seaberry, Jr., both of Eastland, to the higher court.

Allen's appeal from the trial court decision was based on several points, chiefly that "certain evidence excluded in the trial court caused the rendering of an improper judgment," and that the jury used statements not presented in court to determine amounts awarded to each child, it was stated.

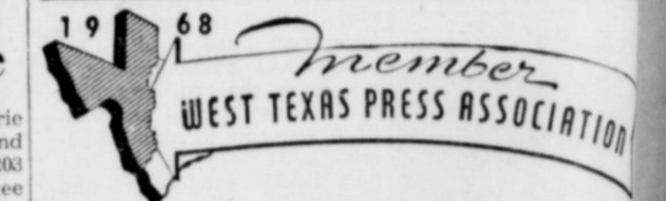

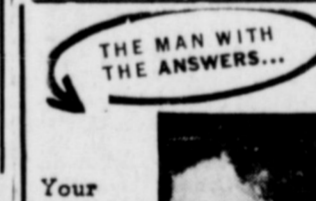

# Starr Dies; Final Services Are Held Saturday

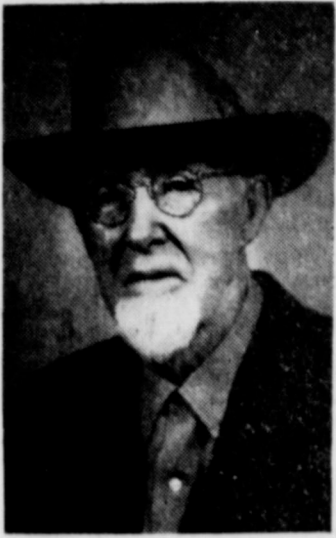
W. B. Starr, Eastland County civic leader for six decades, died Wednesday at the Memorial Hospital after an illness of one year. He was 89 years of age.

Services for Mr. Starr were conducted at 3 o'clock Saturday at the First Church in Cisco with Jesse E. Cassle, pastor, officiating. Burial was in the cemetery at Scranton. Mr. Starr was born April 11 at Richmond, Indiana, and finished the 9th grade at Cisco. He was on August 6, 1903, in the former Elizabethtown, and they arrived in Cisco on Dec. 20, 1903. He owned a farm home, seven miles southwest of Cisco, until 1904.

The Starrs bought 320 acres of land — Highland Springs Farm — and they lived there since coming to Cisco. Over the years, Mr. Starr added to his land holdings, and his cultivated acres grew from one to more than 200 with the balance in pastures.

During a two-year period, 1912-14, Mr. Starr was employed by the T&P Railroad as an agriculture agent and he traveled extensively in West Texas. Following this, he spent two years as secretary of the old Fort Worth-El Paso Highway Association and, in 1916, he went to Midland for two years as secretary of the Chamber of Commerce. The Starr home was maintained in Cisco, however, and he returned in 1918 to stay.

Mr. Starr helped organize the Southwestern Peanut Association some 30 years ago and served as its first president.

He was appointed on the USDA peanut control board by the late President Roosevelt in 1934 and spent a year serving the territory west of the Mississippi River. Mr. Starr was one of the organizers of the Comanche County REA, which includes this area, and served as a director for two terms. He was a former director of the Stephenville Production Credit Association. He was active in various Cisco and Eastland County farm programs and organizations.

Mr. and Mrs. Starr raised nine boys and one girl at their farm. One son, Lee Starr, had been associated with his father in operating their farm and livestock interests for the past decade. The Starr peanut allotment of 160 acres has long been one of the region's largest.

Mr. Starr was an early advocate of good farming practices, including crop rotation, winter legumes, etc. The first carload of commercial fertilizer ever used in Eastland County arrived in Cisco addressed to W. B. Starr. He formed a pool some 45 years ago to buy Irish potato seed for area farmers by the carload, and this plan has been used annually since that time.

Four years ago, the Texas Agriculture Experiment Station at Stephenville developed a special type of Spanish peanuts for this region and named the new variety in honor of W. B. Starr, who had been a pioneer in peanut growing. Starr peanut seed are still in

considerable demand.

Mr. Starr's father, the late Joseph West Starr, was an officer in the Union Army during the Civil War, and he died during a visit to Cisco.

Soon after his 80th birthday in 1958, Mr. Starr wrote a statement to be attached to the abstract of title covering the land he owned. It read: "The true wisdom we acquire during our lives comes from our Almighty Father . . . His voice, if we seek it, will guide our steps as we journey through life . . . Many good farmers soon come to realize that the proper care of their soil constitutes a part of God's wisdom . . . The true title to all land rests in the hands of God."

Mr. Starr was a Quaker. Surviving Mr. Starr are his wife of the home; one daughter, Mrs. Ethel Starr Black, Cisco; and eight sons, E. W. Starr of Albuquerque, W. J. Starr of Texarkana, James Starr of San Antonio, Rupert Starr of Dannebrog, Nebraska, Robert and Lee Starr of Cisco, Bruce Starr of Baltimore, and Charles W. Starr of Concord, Calif.

Young trees should be watered during the early years -- but not too much. Once every two or three weeks in dry weather will do the job.
