The responsibilities give us cause for trembling, but the pleasure and satisfaction of serving such fine folks makes us humble and thankful that we have the opportunity of working here.

For a while, we'll misspell some names and probably put some people in the wrong towns - until we get everybody placed, but with your patience, understanding and help plus the fine support from our efficient staffs and crews, we-Il prove to the Philosopher that we were listening through the years when he surely thought we were dozing.-HVO.
