Gary Fox must have been a little dubious last fall when he accepted the coaching job for six-man football at Oglesby High School. He had never seen a game of six-man football.

A 1960 graduate of Olden High School, and a 1965 graduate of North Texas State Teachers College, Fox is no longer dubious. He is happy with his choice; for, behind him are 11 straight victories, no defeats, and the regional championship.

He learned right away that it was a wide-open game, with more reward for imagination than brute strength. And Oglesby's scores indicated that Fox and his players had a lot of both.

Most of their point productions reached beyond fifty, and in some games the contest had to be called, because of a 45-point rule. One game lasted less than a quarter.

Coach Fox and his Tigers won their regional championship from Aquilla Clugars, 77-44. Aquilla had been noted for its defense, having allowed only five touchdowns in its last five games.

Coach Fox is the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Fox of Route 2, Eastland.

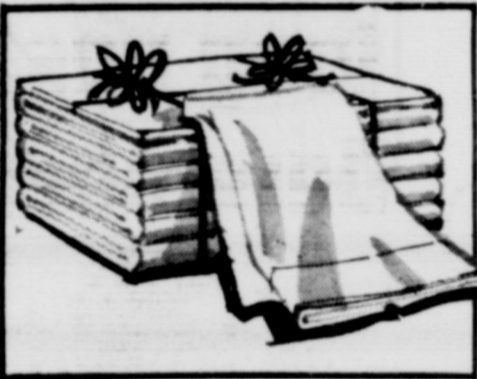

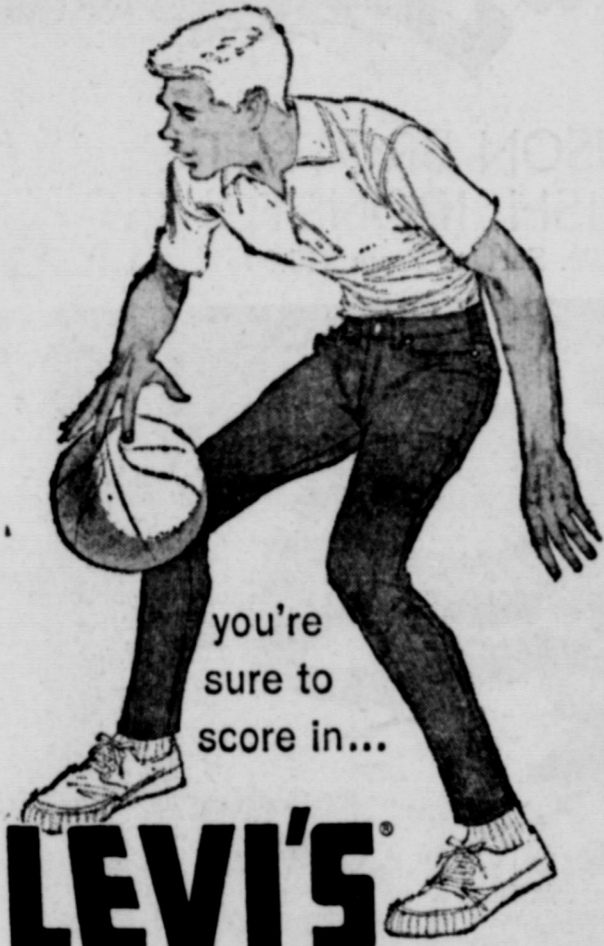

162 Injured in 292 Accidents In County So Far This Year

Dan Knowlan of the Texas Department of Public Safety spoke at the Monday noon meeting of Eastland Rotary Club. He was introduced by Bill Angus, program chairman.

Other highway patrolmen present were Jack Therwanger and Larry Brewer, both of Eastland. Bill Wright of Cisco was a visiting Rotarian.

Knowlan discussed safety procedures designed to cut down the number of vehicle accidents. He said Eastland county has had 292 traffic accidents so far this year, resulting in 162 injuries. The National Council of Safety has reported 33 traffic deaths in Texas during the holidays, but he hopes the fact that Christmas is a "middle of the week" holiday this year will result

in fewer accidents.

The highway patrolman urged drivers to be "individual drivers". "Drive defensively pay attention to your driving, and be an individual", Knowlan said, "Never depend upon the car ahead to make your decisions".

The greatest single cause of fatal accidents, Knowlan said, is excessive speed for existing road conditions. "This is not always an illegal speed", Knowlan stressed. "Sometimes the legal speed is not the safe speed for current conditions. Adjust your current conditions. Adjust your driving to rain, snow, fog, or the amount of traffic. Pay attention to your driving".

Knowlan also discussed two new speed-check procedures now in use in Eastland County.

One is the helicopter and the other is the "Vascar", a car which is equipped with a computer device which can check the speed of another vehicle while the Vascar itself is in motion. The device can check the speed of a vehicle in meeting or overtaking.
