





"In the vote in Nov. 1965, for quotas on the 1966, 1967, and 1968 crops, 97.5 According to the chairman, percent of the 36,415 growers voting approved the quotas. vote in the referendum if he is We are hopeful that the balloting by mail will increase the number of growers voting."

The Chairman explained that the program to be voted on is essentially the same as the one now in operation. When marketing quotas are in effect, price-support loans are available at not less than 75 percent of parity as of Aug. 1 the beginning of the marketing year. Under quotas, too, marketing penalties apply to 'excess" peanuts of growers who exceed their acreage allotments.

If more than one third of the growers voting oppose the quotas, the loans available to growers who plant within their acreage allotments will drop to 50 percent parity, and no quotas or penalties will apply to the 1969 peanut crop. In such event, another referendum would be held next year on quotas for the follow-

ing three crops peanuts. "These are the same dates for the cotton referendum," the Chairman said, "and those producers who have both peanut and cotton allotments will get ballots for voting in each of the referendums." Producers are reminded to be sure to place ballots in the proper envelops when returning them to the ASCS county office. Jesse G. Meredith County Office Manager


