













# Bachelor James Reid Written Up In Reporter

Reporter-News Correspondent EASTLAND RNS) — Every man's dream! Bachelor dig-

month before. Bachelor James Reid, vice president of Eastland National Bank, has just such a place on the west end of Lake Leon. Whether tidied up for the occasion or not, the visitor finds his place as neat as could be. Everything in its place — though to be perfectly truthful, a woman could instantly know it was a man's domain. For "things were where they would be the handiest to get

to. Bachelor Flat is the name of the territory, proclaims the sign out front, its frame holding dozens of giant fish heads. The largest is from a 54-pound yellow cat Reid caught on his trotline. The whole place is strictly functional. A giant 80x80 ft. concrete and grass patio is shared with bachelor neighbor Evan Mitchell. Here as many as 50 persons can be seated at molded concrete tables and benches made by Mitchell. A handmade fish fryer which holds 15 gallons of oil is used often by church groups, Scouts, men teachers from the Eastland School System and others who need a place to entertain a crowd. Reid said that during 1967 he served more than 400 pounds of fish he had caught from the lake to more than 400 persons. He catches yel-

low and channel cat on the trotline and bass with rod and reel. He holds the lake's record catch for bass — 9 1/4 pounds — and has the trophy mounted for proof. Below the 10 ft. rock bluff on which his house is built the shoreline is accessible by stairs. Here is the dock area for his boats. One is a lazy looking little fishing boat with small outboard motor. Nearby is the big powerful speedboat with enough outboard horses for water skiing, another of his hobbies. The grounds are covered with natural Bermuda and St. Augustine grasses beautifully manicured to set off the native trees, live oak, bois d'arc, cypress and elm. On the flood-lighted patio are volleyball court and a ping pong table. Refrigerators and a barbecue pit made from an old castron wash pot set the mood for good food and good fun. The house is a two-room, bath and 16' x 16' sleeping porch structure, with facilities for sleeping 14 persons. On the vinyl floors deer skins are used for throw-rugs. Handmade quilts and blankets are folded neatly in great stacks here and there, bachelor quarters, remember!). There are books, mementos. (Continued on Page 4)

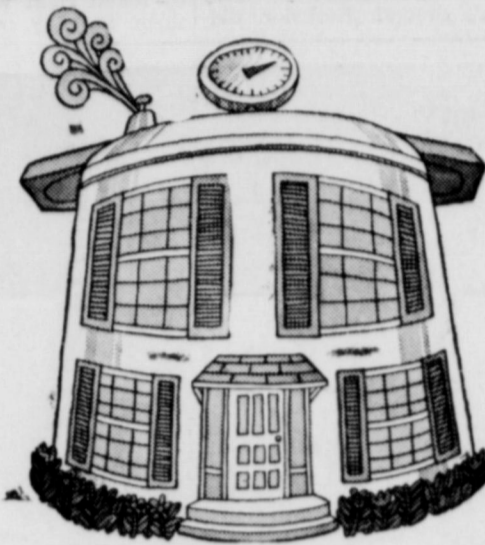

award plaques, pictures of fish, pictures of people. Reid says the TV set gets little use.

In the kitchen things are not arranged according to a decorator's chart but according to the need of this place of rest and enjoyment. Reid's prize kitchen piece is a 51-year-old safe which he garnered from his mother in Eastland.

A beautiful Mallard in full flight, mounted by local amateur taxidermist David Taylor, is poised over a table. Another sits on a shelf in the corner. A large fish-shaped platter with matching bone dishes hang on the kitchen wall, gifts from a neighbor who brought them from Germany.

A guiding rule for this bachelor domain is "No women allowed in the kitchen."

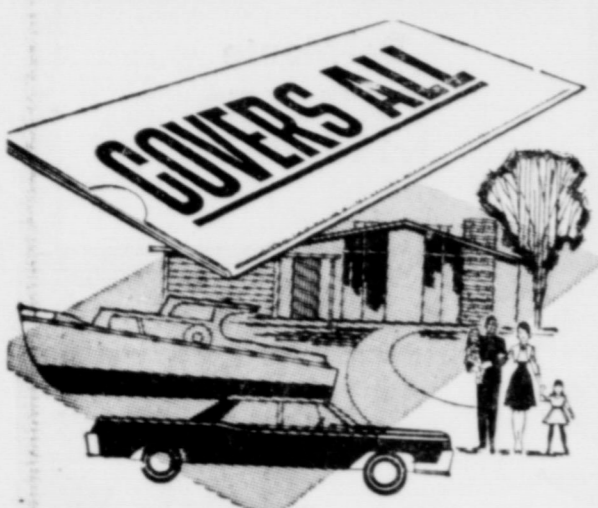

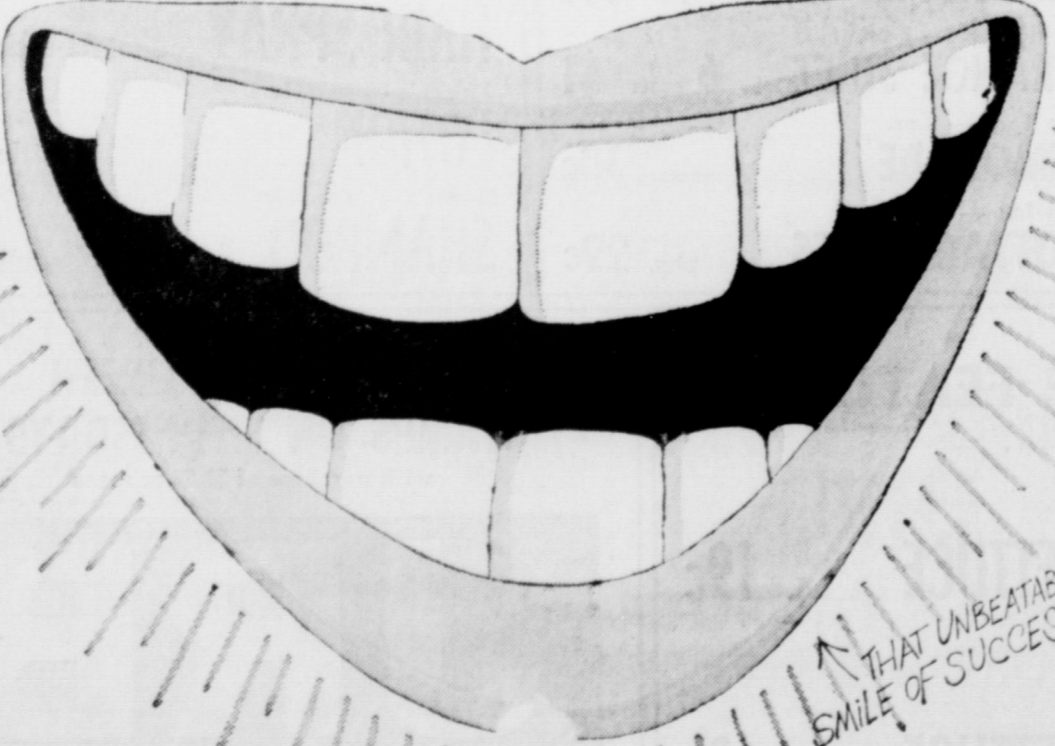

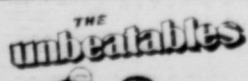
