The show will consist of a display of about 200 entries of top quality pecans representing over 40 different varieties. There will also be a display of cakes, pies and candies. A third feature will be a display of centerpieces using pecans in various forms. Gordon said the best time to see the show would be Friday afternoon and Saturday morning.

The pecans will be processed for judging Friday morning. Friday noon is the deadline for entering pecans in the show. Entries will be judged Friday evening and Saturday morning. The winners in all divisions will be made known sometime Saturday morning. The displays will be taken down after noon Saturday.
