Baptist Body Urges No. 5

Dallas—The Christian Life Commission of the 1.8-million-member Baptist General Convention of Texas has endorsed a proposed constitutional amendment which would authorize the Texas legislature to spend an additional \$20 million for the aged, blind, handicapped and poverty-stricken children in Texas.

Texas will vote August 5 on the proposed amendment, which will appear as Proposition 5 in a list of nine recommended changes in the Texas Constitution.

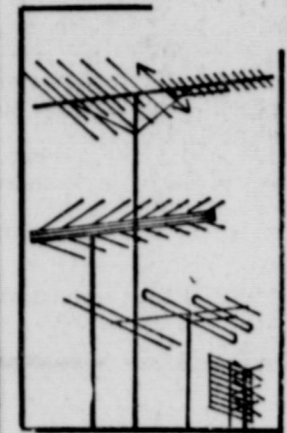

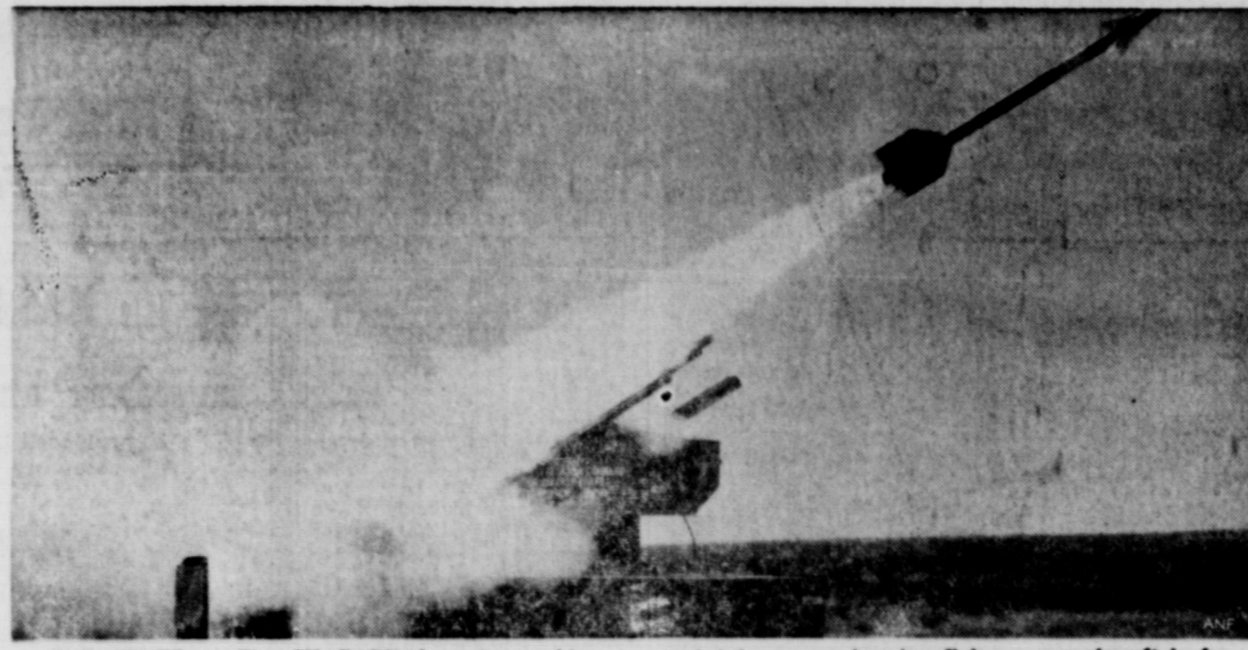
