BOND VOTE CALLED

IN A called meeting Thursday morning the Eastland City Commission authorized Mayor James Reid to call a special election at which the citizens of Eastland will be given the opportunity to take the steps necessary toward updating their much-outdated sewer system. The election will be held Tuesday, Sept. 21 and the amount of local money need will be \$92,000. Total cost of the project will be \$198,700, according to design engineers, and the federal participation in this much-needed improvement will be \$106,700, is reported. It's not so much a matter of wanting to do it as a matter of having to do it. The Texas Water Control Board has been very understanding with the city for many years because they've been assured that Eastland is aware of their sewer problems and has over the years made steps to comply, and now the time comes for actually replacing the present out-dated system. Being out-of-debt as it is, Eastland is in good shape financially, but not to the extent of being able to handle a capital improvement program of this type without some bond help. It'll be set up on as short a repayment plan as possible, and the city has engaged a Fort Worth financial firm to help with the actually details. The commission, recognizing the importance of this undertaking, naturally will be recommending the passage of the bond measure on Sept. 21.
