GREAT CONCERN is previlant here over the widespread of "pandering advertisements" being received through the mail by persons who do not want to receive the, oft-times near obscene material. There's recourse now, says Postmaster Marcus O'Dell, who explains that recent postal regulations provides a way to stop some of the bad-taste mailings. Here's what you do, the P.M. says, bring the material and the envelope in which it came to the post office and ask to fill out a pandering advertisement form. The P.O. will send a registered lefter to the sender of the material ordering no further mailings, with any violations subject to stiff penalities. Individual postal patrons need to work with the post office in stopping this kind of objectionable mailings. Once on, names on some mailing lists are hard to get off, but now it can be done.


High School Observing Library Week In Events
