**Notaries Public  
Appointment Due  
After June 1st**

Secretary of State Martin Dies, Jr. announced that all qualified Notaries Public desiring re-appointment for the new term which begins June 1, 1969 and ends June 1, 1971, must pay the required fee and file a new oath and bond with the County Clerk between May 1, 1969 and May 15, 1969, inclusive.

Mr. Dies emphasized that Notaries Public should not send requests for re-appointment or commissions directly to the Secretary of State inasmuch as the law specifically requires that the County Clerk approve that the Bonds and forward copies of the application to the Secretary of State.

Secretary of State Dies further stated that any person not now a Notary Public who desires appointment for the new term on June 1, 1969, should apply to his County Clerk before May 16, 1969. The applicant must be at least 21 years of age, a citizen of the United States of America and Texas, and a resident of the county for which appointed. The required Application Forms may be obtained from the County Clerk.

**Restoration Is  
Planned At Fort  
Griffin by Uoff**

AUSTIN — A \$9,000 inter-agency contract has been negotiated between the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and the University of Texas for archeological work relative to the restoration of Fort Griffin as a historic site. Fort Griffin is located on the Brazos River in Shackelford County 15 miles north of Albany. The fort was established in 1867 and deactivated in 1881.

Archeologists are to locate and record the location of the quartermaster building; test and record the magazine ruins; record authentic details of the bakery structure; test, verify, and record location of parade ground and flag pole; test and record the location of the sutler's store; and locate, mark, and record existing and discernible foundation lines.

Architectural contracts have already been negotiated for the construction of a visitor center; clearing and capping certain foundations; stabilization work on the magazine to keep it from deteriorating further; construction of a typical hut; stabilization and some work on the bakery; stabilization of other remains of stone structures; rehabilitation of parade grounds; installation of a flagpole; the removal of obstructions which do not go with the time period, and installation of a utilities system.

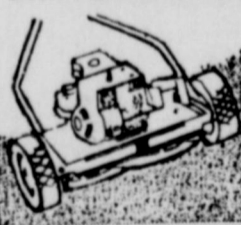

can be profitable as well as enjoyable. But it's a good idea to follow a plan if you want maximum production and the best possible use of space available.

A plan not only helps you determine the size of the garden but is also a big aid in selecting the kinds of vegetables which will give the longest possible harvesting season.

The size of the garden will, of course, depend upon the space available and also upon the number in the family and the amount of time which can be devoted to caring for the garden. Another factor will also be the amount of vegetables you plan to can, freeze or store.

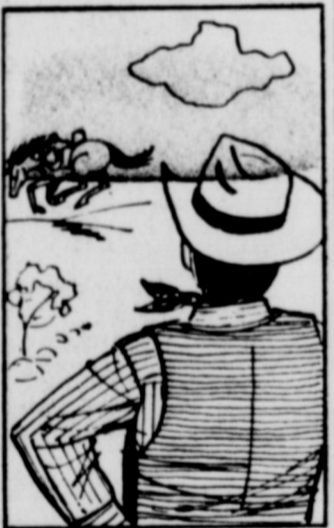
As an aid to home vegetable gardeners, we have a planning guide which not only commended for use in Texas, but also information on planting dates, planting suggestions, expected production and an approximation of the plantings required to meet the needs of an individual for both fresh or stored vegetables.

Copies of the guide, which was prepared by John E. Larsen, Extension horticulturist-vegetables, may be picked up at the county agents office.

The 4-H Adult Leaders Association is sponsoring a tomato project for 4-H members again this year. Any 4-H members in the county can get as many as twelve tomato plants free of charge. 4-H members who want these tomato plants should contact their 4-H leaders or county agents. A 4-H tomato show will be held sometime in July so that members can exhibit their prize tomatoes.

Many people are planning to graft or bud pecan trees this year. If you have trees that need this type of work plan now to attend the annual Eastland County Pecan Budding and Grafting School. It will be held at Cisco, April 18. The school will be held in the new auditorium at Cisco Junior College. The school will again be co-sponsored by the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association and the Cisco Chamber of Commerce. The association plans to have budwood and graftwood for sale.

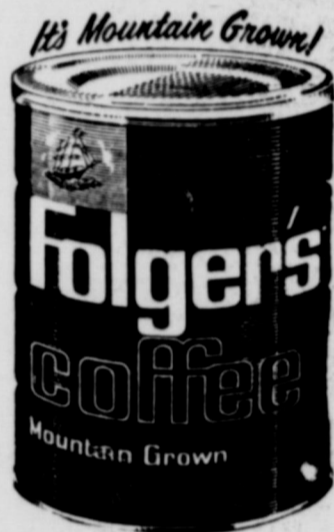

## Local SCD Enters Top District Competition

The Upper Leon Soil and Water Conservation District has entered the 23rd annual Goodyear competition to select the nation's top 53 conservation districts, according to Joe B. Criswell of Rising Star district chairman.

Criswell said the district's outstanding cooperator will be selected from the 4,600 farm operators enrolled in the district program. Nationally over 2,000,000 farmers in over 2,950 districts have signed cooperative agreements with local Soil and Water Conservation Districts.

After lunch the group will practice budding and grafting as Dr. Bill Cardwell's orchard one mile west of Cisco on the old Abilene Highway. Local pecan growers will assist with the practice sessions.

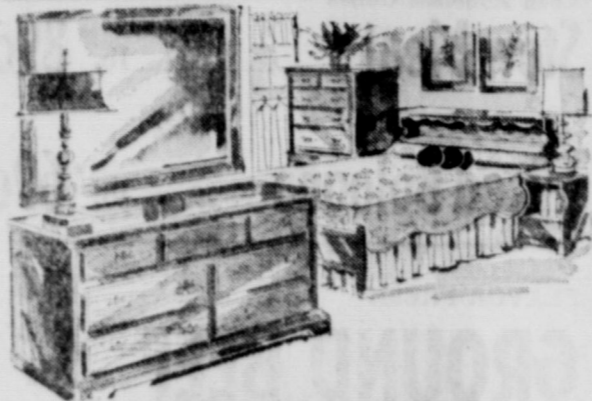

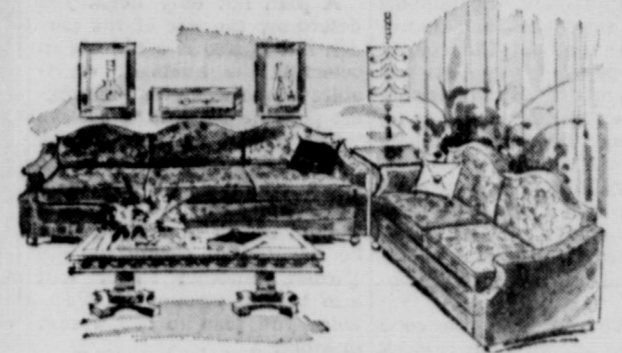

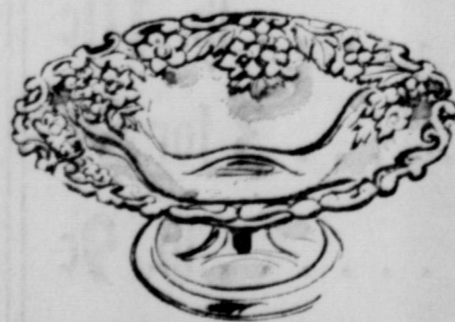

## Turkey Put On Plentiful Food List for April

COLLEGE STATION — Turkeys, perhaps America's most festive birds, are featured on the April plentiful foods list, according to the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Current cold storage holdings are large and prices reasonable, according to the U. S. Department of Agriculture, so you'll find it a good time to include turkey on your shopping list.

Other items on the April "plentiful" list of USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service include prunes, canned and frozen green beans and sweet corn, onions, rice, dry beans and peanut products.

Last year's rice production broke all records and ran 18 percent above 1967. Estimated dry bean production figured at 17.7 million hundredweight, or 16 percent more than last year. At present, pinto beans are in best supply but others include pinks, blackeyes and baby lima beans.
