Bishop Found Guilty Of Murder; Gets 55 Years

A 91st District Court jury has sentenced Henry Bishop, 32, to 55 years in the state penitentiary after finding him guilty of murder with malice in the brutal slaying of popular Ranger-area farmer Travis Winsett, 52, back in June. The jury pronounced Bishop guilty at 2:59 p.m. Thursday and went back into deliberation on punishment and it wasn't until 9:40 p.m. that they announced to Presiding Judge Earl Conner Jr. the 55 year sentence. County-District Attorney Emory Walton prosecuted and Defense Attorney was Bill B. Hart of Eastland. Bishop took the stand and testified Wednesday that the shooting was accidental. Winsett's home had been ransacked and a small safety deposit box found in the house had been pried open. Also missing were a transistor radio, 40 arrow heads, a few coins, including a \$5 gold piece, and a gold ring. Winsett lived alone in a six-room home and officers found a spent cartridge near the front gate about 58 feet from Winsett's home. A small hole was discovered in the window screen. Near a chair in which officers theorize Winsett was sitting, police found dried blood. "Bishop is a Ranger construction worker and antique collector. He was arrested and charged on July 1. Judge

Officers Seek Trail Of Trio That Robbed Bank

The trail of three bandits who robbed the First State Bank of Rising Star of \$9,272 in a hold up about 10:30 a.m. Thursday, had ended Thursday afternoon in a wrecked get-away car lying in a ravine on a farm three miles west and five miles south of Rising Star. The car, an aqua-colored Chevrolet reportedly stolen in Dallas and equipped with license plates stolen at Lubbock, was driven through a cut in a barbed wire fence and run over rocks and broken tree limbs in an effort to conceal it behind some brush. There was no sign of the robbers and officers and FBI agents who went over it with a fine tooth comb, so to speak, speculated that the three had another car left nearby in which they continued their flight.

Sessum, 62, Gorman resident, died at noon Wednesday in Eastland Memorial Hospital where he had been for six days. He retired from the Air Force in 1959. He had lived at Gorman for five years. He married Geneva Vandergriff Feb. 15, 1949 in I-Iip, N. Y. Survivors are his wife; 1 stepson, R. P. Ingram of Austin; one stepdaughter Mrs. R. A. Fawcett of San Antonio; one sister, Mrs. J. O. Kiker of Ruby; one brother, Bobby of Carbon.

False Alarm AT Eastland Spurs Jitters

A "false alarm" shortly after the Rising Star bank robbery centered excited interest on the Eastland National Bank at Eastland Thursday morning. The Eastland police department had just received word that the Rising Star bank had been robbed when, in less than 10 minutes, the bank alarm for the Eastland bank went off at the police station. Police Chief John Morren raced to the bank with shotgun at ready to discover that no holdup was in progress. Telephone line repairs were being made near the bank and it was reasoned a short in the line had caused the alarm to go off. In all it gave cause for concern among lawmen and officials, realizing that the Rising Star job could have been a "draw" to attract officers there and leave other banks vulnerable. Sheriff's deputies, Texas Rangers and other officers left a murder trial in progress in 91st district court to help investigate the Rising Star robbery and join the search.

The majority of the scoring came in the first quarter, and Head Coach Shirley Frazier gave the second half to a training exercise for a great lot of back-up Mavericks. The De Leon Bearcat and Eastland Maverick band half-time shows were scratched due to the wet field and falling rain. Gaining two first downs, the Mavericks pushed over with a handoff to back Rueben Gaeta only to have it called back on an infraction. At the 9, Lund ground two, and handed to Gaeta again who went over seven yards for the next Eastland tally with two minutes left in the first quarter. Extra point surprise came when Lund sprang from his holding position to run the ball over for two points. Eastland was on the De Leon 9 as the first period ended the opening play after field switching, saw Lund scurry over for six more and Eidson kicked the extra point. After the kick return, Hardin gave a preview of what lay ahead in the air—and it cost. Gaeta intercepted the De Leon aerial and moved to the 35. De Leon blocked the Eidson PAT try. The Maverick second units were being worked in as De Leon put together a series worth three first downs and moving the ball goal bound. A personal foul penalty against Eastland helped too, as Hardin connected to Wing Back Larry Kincaid in the left

corner for the first Bearcat score. Harbin did the kicking honors himself to give De Leon their final score. It was 35-7 at the half, and except for one more score, the statistics best tell the story for the second. Lund completed five of 18 passes and Hardin had 11 of 36, with six interceptions. Each team lost three fumbles apiece, and Eastland had 8 penalties for 80 yards, while De Leon committed six for 56. Maverick Guard Steve Lopez got himself two DeLeon passes, the first of which set up another Eastland score. With DeLeon on the 33, Harbin tossed and the 150-pound Lopez was in the right spot and moved to the DeLeon 2 where Lund handed off to Gaeta who scotched over with the second. Lund completed frame. Eidson booted true for the final score. Lopez got his other snag in the fourth during a barrage of air-route tries as the night's chul set in. At the 27 Eidson tried a field goal kick, but it fell wide and the remainder of the game was an exchange with no scoring threats. Harvesting Equipment Slated For Field Day

Modern pecan harvesting equipment will be demonstrated at the fall pecan field day in Eastland County on Friday, Oct. 2. The field day will be in an orchard at Scranton, located on farm market road 1864 in the west part of Eastland County.

Anton White President of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association said the orchard is commonly known as the Silton orchard, but is owned by a group of businessmen in Abilene and managed by Dale Carlile of Cisco.

White said visitors interested in attending the field day may meet at the Spot Restaurant in Cisco at 8:30 a.m. and will then move to the orchard at Scranton. The tour of the 1400 tree orchard will begin about 9:15 a.m. Trailers will be available to take visitors through the large orchard.

White reported that Extension Service specialists will be available to discuss and answer questions concerning pecan production. These specialists will include Dr. J. W. Worthington, horticulturist; Dr. Jerral, Dr. Johnson, plant pathologist; Dr. Clifford E. Hoelscher, entomologist, and Tom Denman, experiment station horticulturist.

The Lockwood Corporation and the Bowie Industries will have pecan shakers and harvesters available for demonstration. Several kinds of power sprayers will also be demonstrated.

White said there will be a catered lunch at the Nimrod Community Center at noon. Harvesting and spraying equipment will be demonstrated in the orchard after lunch.

The field day is being sponsored by the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association. White invited everyone interested in pecans to attend.

Data Processing To Up-Date List Of County Voters

Data processing techniques will deliver better poll lists more economically, announced County Tax Assessor-Collector Edgar Altom. The System is being implemented through an agreement with Western Data Services of Waxahatchie.

Persons who registered in this county last year will receive a fully filled-in application card to be signed and returned to the tax office for registration.

Voters who are also on the county tax rolls, will receive their application card with tax statements due to be received in the mail about Oct. 1. Previously registered voters who are not on the tax rolls will receive the application cards through the mail direct about the same time.

All persons who did not register in this county last year should come by the tax office in order for a data-processing application card to be filled out, he said.

The tax office will be furnished 12 lists of voters for each precinct and four master county copies.

Although the cost of the new system is comparable to the previous system used, efficiency advantages are much greater.
