



Mrs. Mack Knotts Joining Husband At Guam Base



Mr. Thornton. known as 'Punk'' to his numerous friends, had been a resident of Cisco since the middle 1920's when he came here with the Sweetwater Cotton Oil Company to be employed with the company's cotton gin business in Cisco. He had previously been in professional baseball as a plaver or manager at Omaha. Neb., Corsicana and Big Soring.

He acquired the gin property on South D avenue with the decline of the cotton economy and established a feed and seed business which, as the Thornton Feed Mill. grew into one of the largest individually owned operations of its sort in this section.

Born at Lingleville, Texas, in 1900, he was orphaned early and raised and educated in the State Masonic Home at Fort Worth. He was a member of many Masonic orders and took a prominent part in the work and activities of the or-








These, however, do not begin to represent the solution.
