## The John Fosters of Houston, Former Resident of Eastland, Are Visiting in the Home of the Glenn Harts.

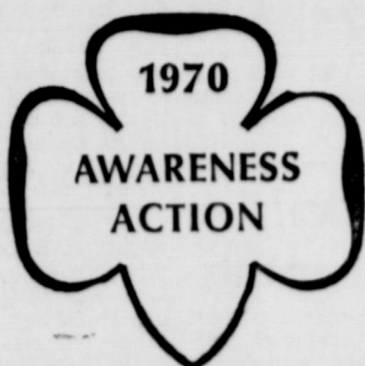

## RJC Takes Third Place In Featherlite Relays

Cisco Junior College, scoring heavily in the field events, ran away with the team championship in the rain-delayed Featherlite Relays here Monday afternoon.

Cisco, scored 79 points and won three out of four field events to wrap it up before the final event, the mile relay.  
Eastland outdistanced Ranger and Clyde in a special high school triangular held in conjunction with the meet.

Four meet records were broken, all in the running events. Meet runnerup Murray State of Oklahoma set two of the new standards, flashing to a 41.3 in the sprint relay and getting a torrid 9.5 in the 100 from Larry Graham.

Ken Moore of Ranger negotiated the high hurdles in 14.5 for another record and Sam Lewis of Lubbock Christian College clocked a 48.5 open quarter for the fourth new mark.

Cisco got most of its points in the field events, with Sam Mathis in the discus, Billy Smalley in the pole vault and Drake Scrievner in the broad jump all taking first places.  
Jerald Lane won the half-mile and Gary Mayo the 400 intermediates to give Cisco a total of five firsts.

Ranger came in third, getting two first places, the other a 47-5 shot victory by Jerry Williams.  
Eastland used massive depth to outscore Ranger, 92-42 in the high school events, while Clyde was third with 38 points. Eastland won eight of the nine running events, but Ranger and Clyde took all the firsts in the field events.

These rare pages were presented by the biblical library of Aboey Kents in California whose founder and honorary chairman is Stanley Slotkin, a millionaire philanthropist of Los Angeles, according to the local pastor, the Rev. Eugene Williams.

The pages to be displayed are as follows:

- 2. Ecclesiastical History — English — 1769.
- 3. Bitten Lehr — German — 1764.
- 4. Tournley Theology — 1752.
- 5. English Commentary — 1734.
- 6. English Bible — 1851.
- 7. Lightfoot Theology — 1684.
- 8. Wilson Bible — English — 1785.
- 9. Helmont Medicine — 1667.
- 10. Spicilegium — Latin — 1750.
- 11. Summa Jurisprudentiae — 1628.
- 12. Crammer's Bible — 1595.

The pages are being mounted and framed along with facsimile copies of the fronts of the Bibles and other volumes from which they were taken. Although only a small segment of the vast collection owned by Mr. Slotkin, the pages in question are a part of a \$4 million collection.

Present plans are to present this showing to the public during the Easter season. The display will occupy a portion of the foyer of the Eastland National Bank.

It is hoped that the public will take advantage of the opportunity to view such a rare collection. Other showings will be arranged according to interest and demand. Members of the Christian Church are delighted to have the opportunity of sharing their good fortune with the residents of this and surrounding communities, Rev. Williams said.
