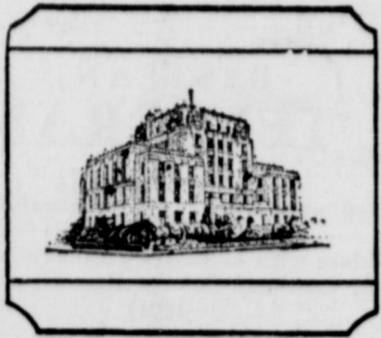

Frank M. Chisum Buried Saturday in Borger Rites

Frank M. Chisum, 69, died
at 2:10 a.m. Thursday in Ran-
ger General Hospital, where
he had been a patient for six
days. He had been ill for sev-
eral years.

Funeral was held Saturday
afternoon at the Calvary Bap-
tist Church in Borger, with
the Rev. Broadmoore, pastor,
officiating.

Burial was in the Leib Cem-
etery, Borger, under direction
of Arrington Funeral Home of
Eastland.

Born November 7, 1900 at
Mobeetee, Texas, he married
Pearl A. Kuykendall May 28,
1936 in Monahans. He retired
from Phillips Petroleum Com-
pany in 1963, after 20 years of
service. He had lived at 210
North Walnut for a year, mov-
ing here from Borger.

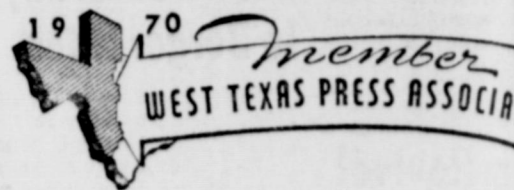

(Continued from Page 1) Magness; in Cisco, Sally Hastings, Clara May Ledbetter, Edna Bint, Naomi Coe, all of Cisco; and Frank Sayre, Jr. of Eastland.

Residents are asked to cooperate with these workers. "Keep the dog chained", is a plea from each worker. Residents who are going to be away from home all day are asked to tape or tack the census form outside the door.

"In taking the census we are trying very hard to get an accurate count of the people in Eastland County, since the 1960 census for Eastland County was never completed.

"A lot depends on this census... the allocation of state

and federal funds; the information necessary to plan schools, roads, streets, housing, etc. But most important, the number and distribution of congressional representatives is determined solely from the results of the census. Next to your voting privilege, being counted in the census is your loudest voice in our government. I appreciate the people with the intelligence and the understanding to realize why our Founding Fathers provided for the census.

"Every day that we the people of the United States have enumerators on the payroll, the more it costs. To keep the cost of this operation as low as possible, a lot of thought and a lot of planning have

gone into providing a system of efficient enumeration. But the system needs the co-operation of individuals in order to keep call backs to a minimum and to make the completion of the census at the earliest possible date. Keep in mind that this is not just any body's tax money that is being spent, it is yours and mine.

"In an effort to conserve everyone's time, 80 out of 100 households are required to fill out only the short form that was received in the mail. The other 20 will be asked additional sample questions by their enumerator that are found on the special long forms. By asking these sample questions at random households we can learn much more

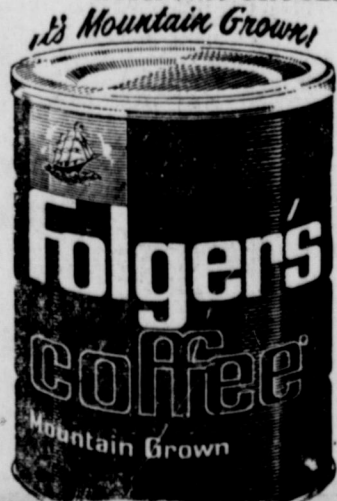

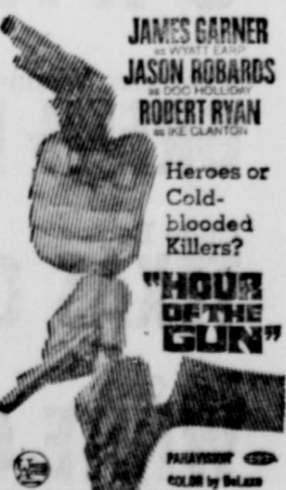

Little damage has been done to our peach and apricot crops by the recent cold weather. According to an experiment station publication "Freeze Probabilities in Texas" our average date last 32 degrees freeze is March 27. However, as late as April 8, there is a 20 per cent chance of a 32 degree freeze occurring. On April 16 there is a five per cent chance of a 32 degree freeze occurring.

All the apricot crop may have been damaged. Apricots inherently bloom early and the tender blooms are easily damaged which usually eliminates the crop. This is the main reason apricots are not recommended for this area. Maybe we should consider moving the annual Eastland County Livestock Show to August 1. The show an dwet weather seem synonymous. But in spite of the messy, wet, cold weather during the show, most agree that we had a good stock show this year.

The show is not just a three day event. A lot of the hard work is done for months before the show. The officers and directors of the County Livestock Raisers Assn. meet once each month for nine months of the year preparing for the show. Three hundred and eighteen people joined the association this year by paying annual dues. This association is the sponsor of the show.

The attendance at the peanut production short course in Gorman March 11 and 12 was very good. Part of the credit for the good attendance should go to several businesses in Gorman who furnished door prizes valued at over \$1,500. The Southwestern Peanut Growers' Assn. and the Pioneer Farmer's Cooperative made the meeting more pleasant by furnishing cookies and coffee.
