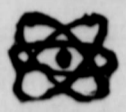

## Senior's 'Girl Crazy' To Be Staged Friday



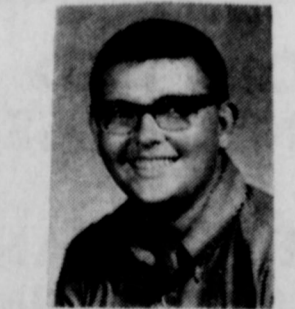
A three-act comedy, "Girl Crazy," will be presented at 8 p.m. Friday, February 21, at Eastland High School auditorium by the Senior Class.

A comprehensive study of the peanut industry and the opportunities available for manufacturing peanut products in this area has been prepared by Texas Electric Service Company.

The study was made as part of the company's Program for Economic Progress (PEP) which is intended to assist communities in the company's service area with economic and cultural improvement programs, according to President Burl B. Hulsey Jr.

Copies of the peanut study will be made available to industrial development groups and chambers of commerce in Eastland, Ranger, DeLeon, and Gorman. They also will be distributed to the West Texas Chamber of Commerce, the Texas Industrial Commission in Austin, and other groups that have expressed interest, such as the Southwestern Peanut Growers' Association.

Texas Electric Service plans to make use of the study in peanut butter, salted peanuts and peanut candy throughout the country to stimulate their interest in this area as a profitable plant location.

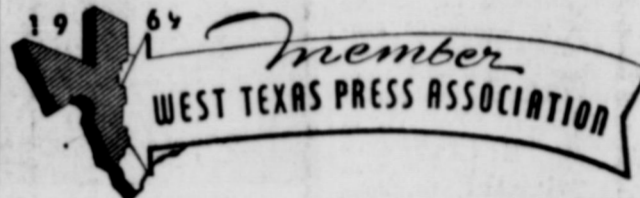

## SUMMARY

There is an excellent opportunity for the production of peanut butter, salted peanuts and peanut candy in the Eastland-Comanche Area by a profit-minded individual or company. All of the resources — raw materials, markets, transportation, labor — are available for profitable utilization. Some of the important factors that form the basis for this opportunity are:

1. The Eastland-Comanche Area is central to the large, reliable Southwestern peanut production region. The three contiguous counties — Eastland, Erath and Comanche — produced 97,373,800 pounds of peanuts in 1967.
2. Two of the nation's largest peanut shelling plants, complete with cold storage facilities, located in Gorman and DeLeon and a smaller shelling plant in Ranger provide for minimum transportation and inventory costs of shelled peanuts. Other raw materials used for candy manufacturing are available in close proximity to the Eastland-Comanche Area.
3. A recent study made by the Texas Employment Commission shows that there are 3,625 workers potentially available to a new manufacturing facility located in the Eastland-Comanche Area.
4. The communities of DeLeon, Eastland, Gorman and

Ranger have excellent distributing facilities for transport by truck or rail.

5. Low cost industrial sites with railroad and highway access and a low tax rate are available in the four communities.

6. The Eastland-Comanche Area is centrally located with respect to the nine-state Greater Southwest market with 31,399,700 persons of whom 40.4% are less than 20 years of age.

7. Within a 600 mile radius of the Eastland-Comanche Area, there is an estimated annual consumption of 69,725,000 pounds of peanut butter, 33,468,000 pounds of salted peanuts and 529,910,000 pounds of candy.
