A Grand Jury's Time Shouldn't be Wasted!

An Editorial

In our opinion the sacredness of the grand jury system has been violated in Eastland County by petty political littleness.

The grand jury is one of the most important pillars of our society and its business is serious. The men who make up grand juries practically give of their time for unpleasant and thankless, but necessary tasks. They have neither time nor temperament for somebody's minute political quarrels.

Since the violation in question involved advertising, the newspapers got dragged into what turned out to be an embarrassing situation for just about everybody, capable of being embarrassed.

It happened like this:

Last Friday, Scott Bailey, county judge candidate, was in the Cisco newspaper office, paying for ads which he had placed in the Ranger paper. He asked if he could see the document, required by law, showing who had paid for another ad which has been running in the Ranger paper. (The ad in question is addressed to Ranger voters and has to do with the recent hospital election.) The candidate was told that the documents are on file in Eastland and could be seen there during office hours.

(The ad is signed 'Pd. Pol. Adv. by friends, and the law requires that records be kept to show who pays for such ads. This newspaper has a record of abiding by the law and this information is available by request.)

No requests were made Monday, but the publisher was called to appear before the grand jury. It is always our policy to cooperate with the courts and law enforcement agencies of every caliber in the interest of justice.

It is no violation of our secrecy oath, which we also hold to be sacred, to report that there were no accusers present, nor had any charges been filed anywhere. Jury secretary Tom Hart later referred only to a mysterious "they" who allegedly asked that the grand jury check to see who had paid for the ad. There was also some point made about the accuracy of election figures given in the ad. While we strive for accuracy not only in our news columns but also in our advertising columns, we can but point out errors and encourage our advertisers to be accurate in their statements.

The publisher supplied the information, the same information that could have been obtained at our office.

The district attorney reported later in the presence of the publisher and candidate Bailey that the grand jury had taken no action on the matter.

Certainly any individual or group has the right to request help from a grand jury—provided they can't get help or information elsewhere. And if there is a group interested in the matter of who is paying for political ads, we'd be glad to discuss the matter anytime.

The publisher apologizes to the jurymen for having had the remotest responsibility for having had some insignificant matter forced onto their busy day of liberation.

It's not likely, but should future grand juries ever run out of anything to investigate, they might consider looking into the matter of 35 stacked-up DWI cases, 14 child desertion cases, and various other criminal cases and office hours in the county court.

Granville W. Jones, 73, a resident of Eastland for the past eight years, died at 9 a. m. Tuesday in Eastland Memorial Hospital.

Funeral was held at 2 p. m. Wednesday in the Killingsworth Funeral Chapel with the Rev. Haston Brewer, pastor of the First Baptist Church in Eastland, officiating.

FHA Financing Planned For Leon Residents Water Supply

O. M. Boyle, County Supervisor of the Farmer's Home Administration met with a group of persons who own property on or near Lake Leon Monday evening in the home of Cecil Reeves on the Staff Road to plan steps to take to conclude an effort that has been going on for some time to bring filtered and treated water to people who reside, either permanently or intermittently on or near the lake.

Since the Morton Valley Water System and the Carbon system were successfully completed on funds borrowed from the Farmer's Home Administration and arranged by Mr. Boyle it seems that a filtered water system around the lake is entirely feasible.

E. F. Arterburn, Cecil Reeves, Jimmy Little and Danny Woods have been working on the project for some time and already have 68 families signed up and paid in their \$50.00 fee.

Mr. Boyle stated that if 130 could be signed up and the \$50.00 fee paid the project could begin the preliminary engineering stage.

at the auditorium last week. "Safeguarding our Future Citizens" was the name of the program and the facts were laid on the line for young and old.

Special speakers were Dr. Bob Alexander and Eudora Hawkins of Abilene, introduced by Club President Mrs. Joseph M. Perkins. Student Shelly Siebert presided and introduced the special assembly program. Philip Smith gave

the invocation and Phil Harrison led the audience in the pledge to the flag. Centering primarily on marijuana, Dr. Alexander summed up in a short phrase why persons should shun the use of the drug: "It's just plain stupid to use it." Offered as his Exhibit A was a beautifully done color film which handled the subject, not on moral grounds, but on common sense. Narrated by Cher of Sonny & Cher fame, the film showed that while the drug has not been found to be addicting, it certainly has a tendency to

physic dependence. The Eastland physician summed up by saying that the use of marijuana is illegal, dangerous to the users and others and is a waste of time. "It can't help you, and it could hurt you, so why bother with it," he asked. Miss Hawkins urged the students to join her in improving traffic safety. Borrowing Gov. Smith's "Drive Friendly" theme, she further charged her listeners to be concerned with their own driving ("Drive defensively to keep that wreck from happening") and also to strive to improve the quality of parents' driving habits, and to go to bat with state legislators to "get the drunks off the highway."

Reading seems to be one of the lost arts of our day. One time reading was the chief interest in every home. One could hardly find a home devoid of bookcases on the shelves of some kind.

In the home of Miss Addie Irby on North Main Street stands a beautiful solid oak book case reaching almost to the ceiling. This bookcase was bought from the Anderson-Jacobs General Merchandise Store years and years ago in Rising Star.

On the left side of the case is a bevelled mirror set in an ornate oak frame above a shelf some 12 inches in depth. Just below the shelf is a hinged door of carved wood that lets down to form a desk. For a number of years James Irby, father of Miss Addie Irby, was justice of the peace of Rising Star and later commissioner of this precinct. One shelf in the bookcase holds leather bound volumes of "Revised Statutes of Tex-

as," "Style's Guide For Justice," "Encyclopedia of Law," and "Forms and Notes, by Spalding."

Mr. Irby, embossed leather encloses "The Pathway of Life," a Biblical volume with illustrations from original "Dante's Inferno" translated from the original of Dante Alighieri by Henry Francis Cary.

"The Gray Jackets and How They Lived and Fought and died for Dixie. Approved for publication in the year 1867."

Ten volumes of "Masterpieces of The World's Literature, containing masterpieces from the pens of Phillips Brooks, Robert Burns, John Bunyan, Robert Browning, Grimm Brothers and many many other great writers are on the shelves.

There are copies of the Texas Christian Advocate, a periodical published by the Methodist Publishing House, dating back a number of years, and "A Conference Journal of the Central Texas Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, dated November 16, 1914.

There are histories of Methodist, Wars and Histories of America, and "The Book of The Fair" 1904." Mr. Irby attended the Fair in St. Louis Mo., and brought the book and souvenirs home for the family. The book contains illustrations of the Exposition.

Two shelves have books of fiction, old, old school text books, books on etiquette and a Texas Almanac dated 1904, priced at 35 cents.

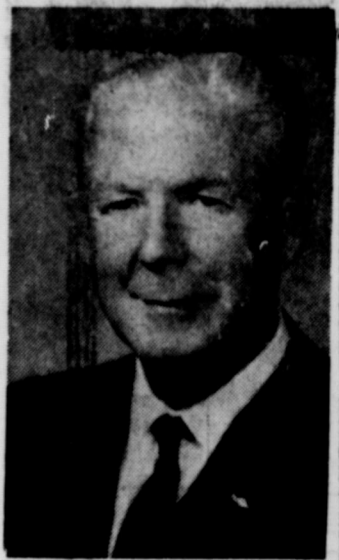
A Hygienic Physiology is there, belonging to John Irby, the eldest son in the Irby family. He was a high school student in the Rising Star school. The book bears the date February 24, 1897.

A book titled "Family Government," graces one of the shelves.

At last there is a family album bound in red velvet and an unidentified hard surfaced, shiny material decorated with silver letters and leaf motif. Inside the album are pictures of friends, family and relatives made in years past. Among these photographs are five children in a group, the children of the late Mr. and Mrs. T. B. Roberds, early settlers in this section, and parents of Fred W. Roberds, long time banker and business man in Rising Star. One of the children in the picture is Fred at the age of nine years. There are pictures of two beautiful Bucy sisters, Mary and Mattie, later Mrs. Mary Boase and Mrs. John G. Robinson, mother of Miss Mina Robinson and Mrs. Cecil Joyce, both living at Rising Star. Baby Addie Irby at the age of two years, a cherubic baby with dark curly hair is shown holding a "wax doll," in her arms. John Irby a handsome young man at the age of twenty one is pictured.

Picture postcards hold a place of prominence in the album, dating back to 1904-1907.

There are calling cards of that era too. Cards tinted a delicate pink, decorated around the edge with dainty flowers, forget-me-nots, pansies and daisies in natural colors. The bearers name printed across the middle of the card. The contents of this lovely old bookcase of other years seems to speak a message of faith, courage, endurance, stability and much good reading of our beloved ancestors.

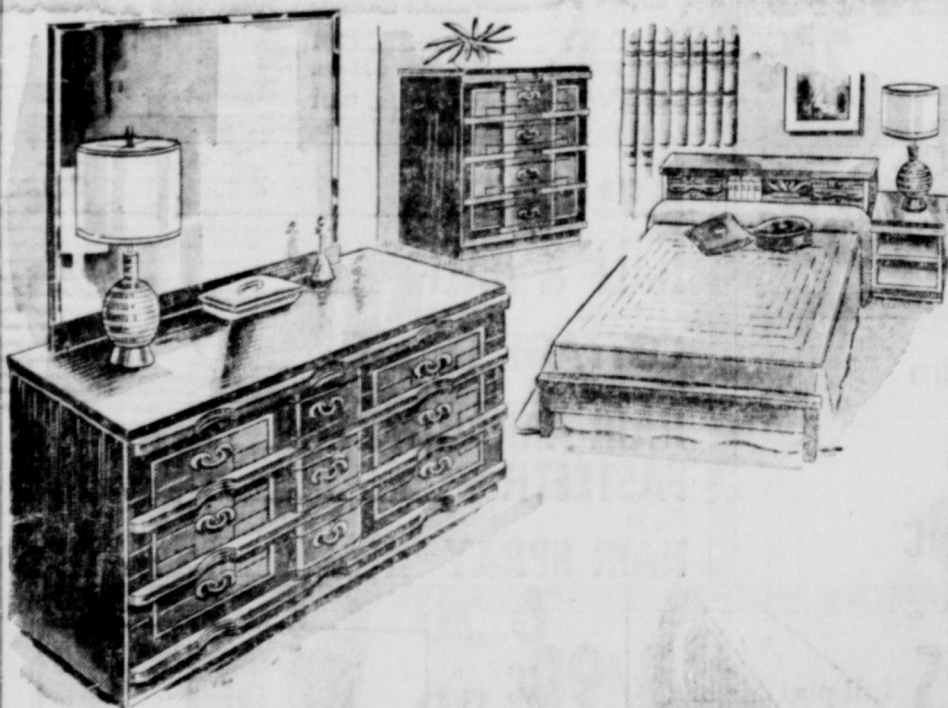

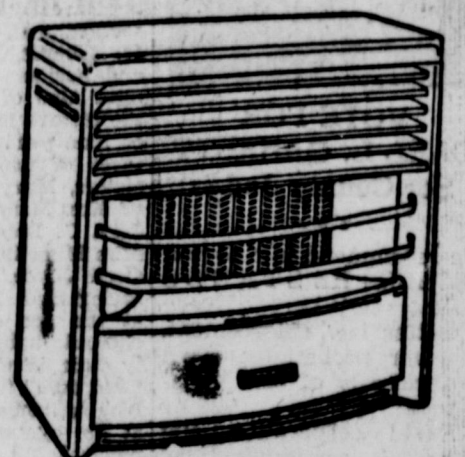
