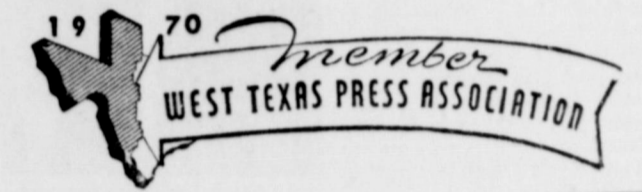

Price Outlook Good, Field Day Group Is Told

Despite one of the heaviest insect infestation in several years, the 1970 pecan crop promises to be a little above average for much of Central Texas, according to reports by program speakers and visitors at the annual Eastland County Pecan Field Day 12 miles southwest of Cisco Friday.

The northern part of the region, including Jack and Stephens Counties, has been hit hardest by insects, while counties in the central and southern areas have fair to outstanding crops, the pecan men reported. The price outlook is good, they agreed.

The pecan case bearer, which attacks the nuts while they are tiny, is still the No. 1 enemy of the pecan orchard, according to Dr. J. W. Worthington, extension horticulturist at the Stephenville Experiment Station. This year, the case bearer showed up in early June and those who did a good job of straying have good crop prospects.

Dr. Clifford E. Hoelscher, extension entomologist at Stephenville warned that pecan men should be alert for any signs of weevils, which strike just before the nuts reach the harvest stage—early October. Few weevil

PROCLAMATION BY THE COUNTY JUDGE OF EASTLAND COUNTY To All to Whom These Presents Shall Come:

I, Scott Bailey County Judge of Eastland County, do hereby declare the week of October 4-10, 1970 as FIRE PREVENTION WEEK IN Eastland County, for the following reasons:

WHEREAS, according to the National Fire Protection Association—FIRE'S DAILY TOLL... every single day in the U.S. is an average of 33 lives, 1,495 homes, 196 apartments, 26 schools and college buildings, 10 churches, 22 hospitals and nursing homes, 111 farm buildings, 180 industrial plants, and 219 stores, restaurants, and office buildings.

WHEREAS, fire claimed 12,000 lives and \$2.4 billion in losses last year as a result of ordinary human carelessness — a failure to observe basic safety precautions;

WHEREAS every year about half of America's destructive fires occur in towns under 10,000 population; and

WHEREAS we feel that rural America should be specifically included in FIRE PREVENTION WEEK, October 4-10, 1970, we urge all rural citizens of this county to be especially careful in using liquefied petroleum products, electrical appliances, as well as oil or gas fired space heating systems; and

WHEREAS consideration should be given to protecting all farm buildings from lightning damage, that all trash is burned in an approved manner, that all heating systems are in proper working order, and that good house-keeping is practiced not only during FIRE PREVENTION WEEK, but 365 days of the year; and

WHEREAS the Eastland County Farm Bureau, in conjunction with all fire departments in the county have worked together to emphasize fire prevention and protection in the rural areas as well as in our cities and towns;

THEREFORE, I urge all citizens of Eastland County to join hands in recognizing this special period by working together fifty two weeks a year to more fully realize the benefits of FIRE PREVENTION WEEK.

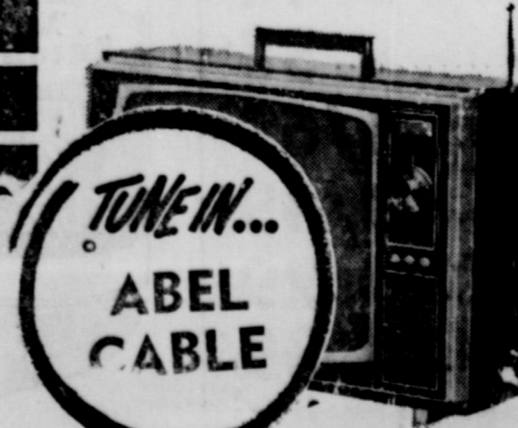

Carlile, whose 1970 crop appears outstanding, said he cultivated the orchard 11 times this year to keep the ground clean, put out some 200 pounds fertilizer per acre, and to spray twice. He used a Savin-Zinc-Duter mixture June 4th to control case bearers and to treat for rosette and other diseases. On July 25th, his sprayers used a Savin-Sulphur-Zinc mixture for similar problems.

The orchard was planted by Dallas Jobe in the early 1930s and progress in the 160-acre orchard has been slow. At present, the trees are huge, well trimmed and healthy and the orchard appears ready for peak production. It was pointed out, Hall has damaged the trees several times, but no signs linger.

After a luncheon at the Nimrod Nig Progressive Club house, the pecan men returned to the orchard for a demonstration of harvesting and spraying equipment. Tree shakers made by Gould, Lockwood and James-Way were on hand. They can handle trees up to 36 inches in diameter and can reach up some four and a half feet.

Harvesting equipment is a good investment, Carlile said. You save time, have a minimum of crop loss, and get your nets at the best time, he said. Harvesting machines sell from \$2,000 to \$12,000.

Gordon and the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association sponsored the field day, which was described as a good success from all standpoints.





A plan is a survey of the existing criminal justice system, including problems, need resources and priorities, of the entire region, which is made up of the counties of Knox, Kent, Stonewall, Haskell, Throckmorton, Scurry, Fisher, Jones, Shackelford, Stephens, Mitchell, Nolan, Taylor, Callahan, Eastland, Runnels, Coleman, Brown and Comanche. Mayes said that the document is a result of data collection on the national and state levels, with a large amount of information obtained by interviews with the public officials throughout the area. "If we are to maintain or improve the low crime index rate that we have experienced in this area in the past, then we must diligently strive to maintain a strong, fast-moving law enforcement improvement program in this region," he said. Along with the proposed annual action program, the plan sets forth long-range goals in a multi-year (five year) plan. It calls for concentration on such areas as upgrading law enforcement personnel, prevention of crime, improvement of community relations, improvement of information and communications systems, and construction of facilities.
