# IT HAS BEEN

A terrific explosion was heard throughout the town of Rising Star on Monday, March 9, 1959 about 5:30 p. m. On investigation it was discovered to be on North Main Street at the Majestic Hotel. The North, East and South walls of the forty-year-old, two-story hotel were ripped out by the blast, caused by leaking gas lines under the building. In a very short time the hotel was completely destroyed by the fire, as was a rent house across the street north of the hotel, belonging to A. P. Smith.

Across the street east plate glass windows were shattered by the blast. Glass was thrown north and east for hundreds of feet. Durwood Fussell and Ottis Lee, owner of the station, were sitting in the station and were both knocked out of their chairs. Although they were covered with shattered glass and shocked by the unexpected explosion, neither was injured.

Mrs. Louise A. Weber, owner and manager of the hotel, was dazed by the blast and was led from the building by firemen. None of the hotel guests were in the building at the time.

The 22-room frame hotel was built in the early twenties during the Rising Star oil boom and had been owned by Mrs. Weber for twenty-five years.

Dr. Ben H. Bradley was elected Lions Club president in April, 1959. Dr. Bradley warned the members that he would expect their coopera-

tion in a program that would make the club more effective in the civic and commercial life of the community. "I'll get that cooperation or you will get this gavel back" warned the new president. "It's going to take more than donations. It's going to take work and more work," he said.

J. Walter Smith was unanimously elected to his sixth term as Mayor of Rising Star April 7th, 1959. Aldermen elected were Bill Burton, Glen Henry, Bedford B. Morris and Lane Wells.

Baccalaureate services for the twenty-six members of the high school graduating class were held in First Baptist Church with the Rev. Ed Jackson preaching. The Rev. Bob Cook, pastor of First Methodist Church, gave the invocation and Minister Harry Tansil of the Church of Christ, gave the benediction.

Commencement exercises for the class were held in the high school gym on Tuesday evening, May 26, 1959. Jack Smith, a member of the class, gave the invocation. Essie Hearren, valedictorian and Nelda Lee salutatorian, both spoke before the Commencement address by Rev. Ben H. Moore, Presbyterian minister of May, Texas.

The Rev. Moore told the seniors "Life does not hand out careers on silver platters, you must make your own job."

Laveda Boggs played the recessional.

When school opened that fall, 331 students enrolled, 108 in high school and 223 in elementary school.

Four inches of rain fell within two hours on July 21, 1959, sending Copperas Creek surging out of its banks, on South Mesquite.

For a time it looked as if there would be a repeat performance of the flood of 1957 but business men and volunteer workers damed up doors with planks, sacks of sand and bran. Furnishings were stacked high above the water and very little damage was reported.

Sections of residential areas in north west and south Rising Star were flooded with water. Water ran over Highway 183 south of town and Highway 36 to a depth of more than a foot.

Drainage ditches overflowed and a City gas line was broken by the impact of debris piling up, the damage was quickly repaired.

## A LOOK AT: Amendment 1

The proposed amendment to Article V, Section 1-a, of the Texas Constitution, alters Subsections (5), (6), (7), (9), (11), (12), and (13). The present section covers the retirement and compensation of justices and judges. The proposed amendment was drawn to enlarge the jurisdiction of the State Judicial Qualifications Commission and to enlarge its powers on censure and removal from office of all state and local justices, judges, and justices of the peace whose conduct is deemed inconsistent with the proper performance of the duties of the court. Examined by subsection, the proposed changes would:

(5) Add censure to the powers of the commission and extend the scope of the subsection to include "any person holding an office named in Paragraph A of Subsection (6)."

(6) Expand the authority of the commission to cover county judges, county court at law, domestic relations court judges, juvenile court judges, probate court judges, corporation or municipal court judges, justices of the peace, and any judge or presiding officer of any special court created by the legislature. Currently, Article V, Section 1-a, covers only justices and judges of the appellate courts and district and criminal district courts. The amendment would also provide for censure in lieu of removal from office under this subsection. Under Paragraph B involuntary retirement for disability may be extended to the expanded group of officials eligible for retirement benefits, if not eligible for retirement benefits, these officials may be removed from office for disability seriously interfering with the performance of duties if the disability is or is likely to become permanent in nature.

(7) Authorize the commission to keep itself informed as fully as possible concerning the misconduct of disability of the officeholders named in Subsection (6)

(8) Expand commission authority so that it may issue a private reprimand without a hearing or issue public cen-

sure after a hearing to an officeholder named in Subsection (6).

(9) Add censure to the powers of the Texas Supreme Court under the review provision of the article.

(11) Provide for the due process of law for all officeholders named in Subsection (6).

(12) Provide that no person holding an office named in Subsection (6) shall sit as a member of the commission or supreme court in a proceeding involving his own retirement or removal.

(13) Make Article V, Section 1-a alternative to and cumulative of the methods provided elsewhere in the constitution for removal of persons holding an office named in Subsection (6).

The Texas electorate in 1965 adopted the current Article V, Section 1-a. The section greatly expanded the article in regard to the retirement and removal from office of justices and judges of the appellate courts and district and criminal district court judges nor did the section include the judges of the other state and local courts. The proposed amendment to Article V, Section 1-a, was designed to change the provision to include these features.

## Crop Estimates To Be Taken In State Survey

Information supplied by some 25,000 Texas farmers and ranchers will become the basis for the official crop production estimates for each county and the State.

A representative number of farmers and ranchers in Eastland County will be among the 25,000 in Texas receiving the questionnaire from State Statistician Cary Palmer of the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service in Austin. The questionnaire will be mailed during the last half of October and early November.

Accurate estimates are of great importance to producers in planning their production and marketing, farm program participation and also for providing an unbiased picture of Texas agriculture.

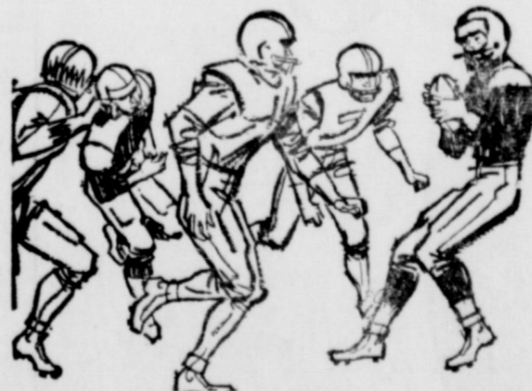
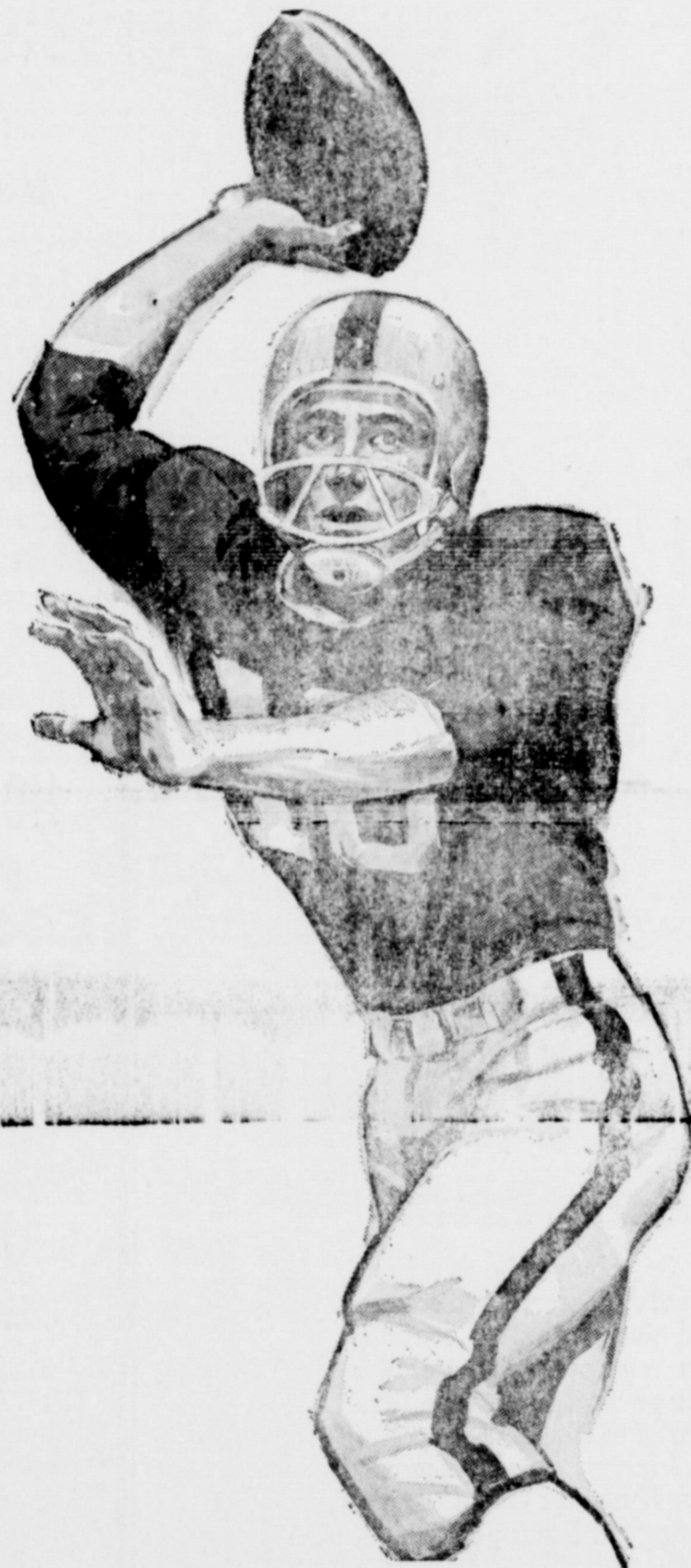

## Excellent Dove-Hunting in Leon-Bosque Conservation Area

By Soil Conservation Service Resource Conservation and Development Project. Of the five counties within the area, excellent dove hunting can be found in the Leon-Bosque

tion of tree hunting has caused some problems. Many landowners have had unfortunate experiences with the public and are now reluctant to allow hunting on their lands for free or fee. Some farmers and ranchers do not fully recognize the opportunities to lease and are not aware of the number of sportsmen who are willing to pay for a good place to hunt. The attitudes of friends expecting to hunt owners hesitate to charge a fee.

Another problem is related to the size of land-holdings and use of the land. Small units cannot always provide good wildlife habitat in sufficient quantity to attract large populations of game animals. Even though this problem is not nearly as significant for doves as for some other game such as deer, quail and turkey, it is still important. Opportunities exist for farmers and ranchers to pool their lands and form hunting organizations. Neighbors can cooperate to improve wildlife habitat over a larger area, thereby increasing game and improving hunting.

Need for more wildlife habitat is a problem which every landowner can do something about. By developing odd areas into wildlife food plots, the game can be increased and concentrated in certain areas. This will improve hunter success. Sunflower patches and grain fields attract the birds. Barren areas can be disked or otherwise mechanically disturbed to encourage croton, ragweed and other seed-producing forbs. These "weeds" provide good quail and dove food. Food and cover developments near waterholes are especially good since doves need water daily.

Proper use of grazing lands should leave adequate vegetation to provide good wildlife food and cover. Overgrazing reduces food supplies and nesting cover so most birds move on to areas of better pickings.

Advertising for hunters is essential. The availability of hunting needs to be publicized. This can be done individually or through organizations, but the potential hunter must be informed of the opportunities awaiting him.

The landowner that takes advantage of his opportunities to lease hunting rights can "kill two birds with one stone." He not only brings economic returns to himself and the area, but he helps fulfill a public need for outdoor recreation. Legal harvesting of game is also a service to the wildlife community by helping to keep populations in balance with the environment.

## FHA Rural Loans Houses 21,000 In State Areas

Rural housing loans made through the Farmers Home Administration during the past fiscal year provided better housing for an estimated 21,000 people in the rural and smaller communities of Texas. The 4,604 loans, totaling \$37,173,160, covered the purchase of improvement of individual family homes, plus \$1,322,910 for rental housing units.

Nearly 650 Texas retail lumber dealers, Farmers Home Administration personnel and other interested parties attended a series of 17 one-day workshops designed to instruct the lumber dealers how to process applications for rural housing loans. Tom Yager, president of the Lumbermen's Association of Texas, stated that the seminars, conducted by FmHA personnel, "were enthusiastically received and proved to be one of the most effective and informative ever scheduled by the association; now interested families may get information and assistance from the local lumber dealer as well as through the county supervisors of the Farmers Home Administration."

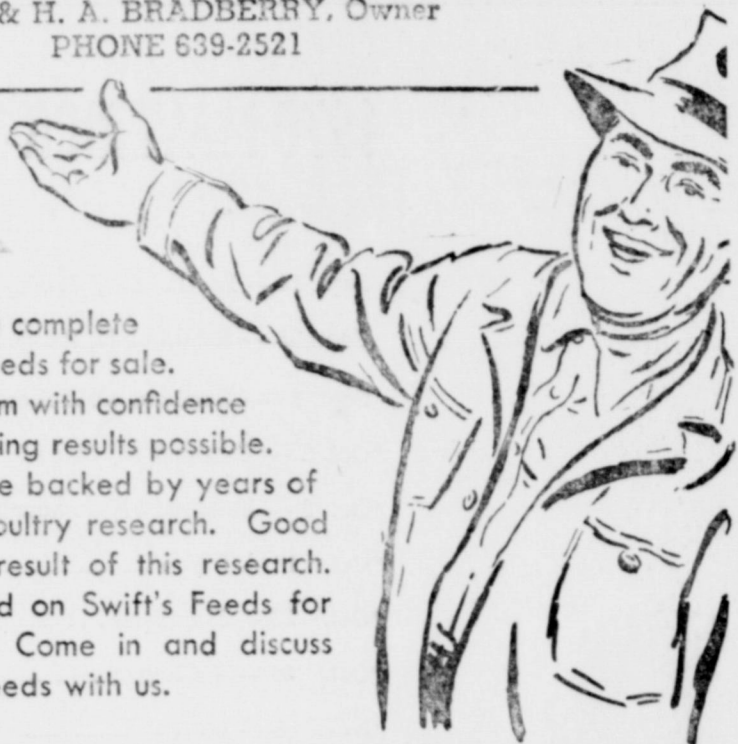

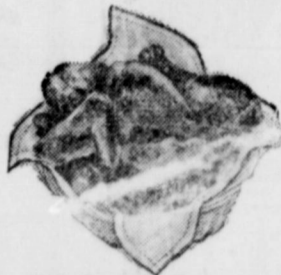
