The Potential for manufacturing peanut products in this area. INTRODUCTION

Two Texas counties, Eastland and Comanche, are the center of the most important peanut producing area in the Southwest. It is the purpose of this study to illustrate the opportunities which exist for utilization of this valuable raw material in the manufacturing of peanut products in the Eastland-Comanche Area and, specifically, in the communities of DeLeon, Eastland, Gorman and Ranger.

This study begins by exploring the structure of the peanut industry. Then the economic determinants of peanut products manufacturing which exist in the Eastland-Comanche Area are analyzed and evaluated, and the opportunities for peanut butter, salted peanut, and candy production in the Eastland-Comanche Area are defined.






