THE HORROR of war etched more deeply this week as relatives awaited and a war-chief viewed the bodies of a Vietnam soldier who paid the last full measure of devotion.

ARMY PRIVATE James D. Jackson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Jackson, Rt. 5, Fort Worth and great nephew of Mrs. Carl White of Ranger, died June 14 in a Vietnam hospital five days less than one month after being wounded by Viet Cong machine gun fire.

THE SOLDIER is remembered as a member of Aledo High School football team who saw brilliant action during a Ranger-Aledo game played in Weatherford. He was Aledo's "all-district" in football, baseball and basketball in 1968 and later played for Northwood Institute.

LETTER JACKET was traded for the green combat uniform of the 101st Airborne and Vietnam became his address last November.

THE ATHLETIC fought several major battles before the ill-fated day when spewing lead reduced his muscular legs to bloody stumps. The left leg was gone above the knee; the right leg was amputated below the knee. Arm and head wounds and cessation of kidney function were too much for the stout bodied, home loving patriot.

A LETTER to relatives included such statements as: "This is an undeclared war. We are among the unqualified, doing the unnecessary for the ungrateful." In an avid letter to friends in the States he penned his thoughts: "I fight for the people who have died in this war; I fight for my friends beside me; and I fight for my life."

LAST WEEK, Pvt. James Jackson lost that battle.

Meeting with the group were E. L. Foster, District Supervisor, Farmers Home Administration, and O. M. Boyle, County Superintendent.

Mr. Foster pointed out that there are over 700 water systems serving approximately 118,000 families operating in Texas and financed by Farmers Home Administration.

Kendrick Wild West Spectacle In Rehearsal

The Kendrick Wild West Spectacular is now in rehearsal.

Annually presented on July 4 in the huge open air amphitheatre midway between Eastland and Cisco on Highway 80, the spectacle utilizes local amateur talent in scenes that relive the days when this land was settled by the ancestors of the present generation.

Besides its value as a unique entertainment feature, the spectacle helps provide the funds to make possible the Easter Pageant which the Kendrick family presents free of charge to the public each Easter season — a dramatic religious representation which has gained this section nationwide attention.

To do this the Wild West Spectacular is offered at admission prices of \$1.50 for reserved seats and \$1.00 for general admission, all proceeds being devoted to the Easter Pageant fund.

Many door prizes of cash, ranging from \$100 and \$50 to \$10 and \$5, will be awarded at the end of the show. Everyone has a chance to win one

of these prizes, the Kendrick family spokesman said.

The Wild West production to be presented at 8 p.m., Sunday, July 4, will consist of singing, dancing, barroom brawling, shoot-outs, bank robberies and many other scenes reminiscent of old times, and will be climaxed with a "hellfire and brimstone" preacher in an old brush arbor scene, since July 4 falls on Sunday.

The grand finale will be a gigantic fireworks display designed on events in the life of Christ, something unique in the art of fireworks shows.

The entire presentation is written, arranged for pageantry, directed and produced by the Kendrick families, and the best talent that can be found in the Eastland County parts. The family is hoping that the 1971 production will be the best ever.

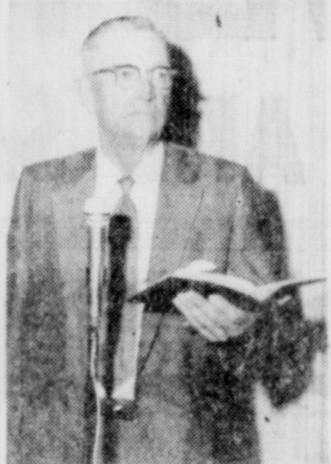

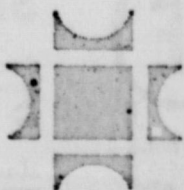

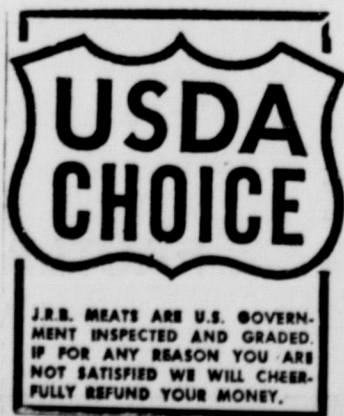
