

Fact is, she bought a pair of shiny, high-top, go-go-type boots which she'd just love to wear, but hasn't 'cause she's just sure her husband won't approve. So note all husbands: gently suggest that your wife sure would look pretty in a new pair of go-gos. If you're the lucky one, your wife will run to the closet and bring out hers already paid for. If not, your wife'll love you anyway, 'cause she may just have been waiting to find out how you stand on high-top boots.

If there's 2.1 people who live in your 4.7-room home, which cost \$6,200 (or if you rent, for \$42 a month), then you're average in Eastland County.

So says the Bureau of Census, according to data just released.

There's a total of 8,238 dwellings in the county occupied and 91 unoccupied, and the population is 18,092.

Did you know that there are 187 one-room dwellings? There are 267 with eight rooms or more. According to the 1970 data there were 165 mobile home or trailer dwellers. How about this: 880 lack some or all plumbing.

There's a lot of couples in the county: 2,781 in housing, and quite a few (1,741) singles, living alone. There's 53 dwellings with eight persons or more.

How many \$50,000 homes are there in this county? 10 says the Census people.

## Symphony To Be Bonus for CJC Affairs

Cisco Junior College today began a two-week Season Ticket Drive for its 1971-72 Current Affairs Series. The series, which was announced some three weeks ago, will

Lester Maddox. A bonus to season ticket buyers will be free tickets to the October 19 "Pops" Concert by the Dallas Symphony Orchestra. The concert will

feature light classical music during the first half, and the DALLASOUND "pop" and "rock" selections during the second portion.

Dr. Banks will be at CJC on October 25, with his famous speech on "What To Do Until the Psychiatrist Comes" which is the second most frequently given talk in the world. Miss George, who has just stepped down as Miss America of 1971, will speak and entertain on December 4. Her subject will be "It's Up to Us". Astronaut John Glenn, the first American to orbit the earth, will talk on: "America Today: What Should Our Priorities Be?" which will reflect the general theme of the series of "What Will America's Priorities Be?" Governor Maddox, who is now actually lieutenant Governor of Georgia, will speak on "The True Gap: Honesty, Not Generation." The two spring semesters programs are January 24 for Mr. Glenn and April 11 for Governor Maddox.

Season tickets are priced at \$10.00 for adults and \$4.00 for public school and college students. The regular price for each program if bought individually, is \$2.50 for adults and \$1.00 for students, including the Dallas Symphony concert. By purchasing season tickets the concert becomes a free bonus.

Eastland's Larry Bolles got himself a Cisco pass after a string of unimpressive series (during which Eastland tried a couple of unsuccessful field goals), and the Mavericks were set up again at the one-yard line. Jiminez chose Joe Herrera for the last Eastland touchdown and Leo Gaeta ran the extra points over to end the scoring. Bolles intercepted another Cisco bomb, and...
