This amount, however, is only a small portion of the total
amount collected from the legal sale of beer in the countr. Figures taken from amount collected from the legal sale of beer in the county. Figures taken from sworn reports by dealers to the Texas Liquor Control Board show that a tax of
$\$ 14,732.74$ was collected by the State of Texas on beer legally sold in Eastland county during 1938. This same beer paid $\$ 58,930.96$ in taxes to the Federal government during the same period. Thus we see that a total of $\$ 77,096.20$ of badly needed revenue was collected from the sale of beer in this county in one year's time. The State of Texas during 1938 collected a total of $\mathbf{\$ 6 , 4 9 8 , 0 6 6 . 2 6}$ from taxes and license fees on alcobolic beverages. Three-fourths of the tax goes to the payment of Old Age Pensions and une-fourth to the Available Schooi Fund. (Figures and information taken from Page 34, Fourth Annual Report Texas Liquor Control Brard). The importance of the Federal tax mentioned above will be realized when it is remembered that the Federal governmen matches the state dollar for dollar in the payment of Oid Age Pensions.
