Mothers To Be Honored Sunday At Bethel Church

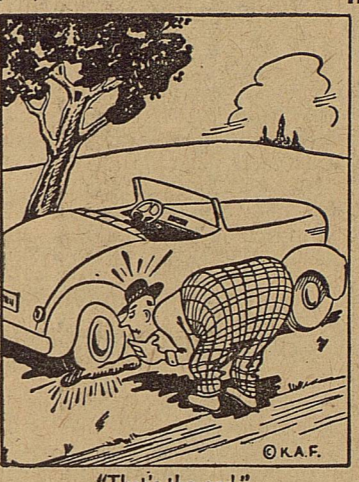

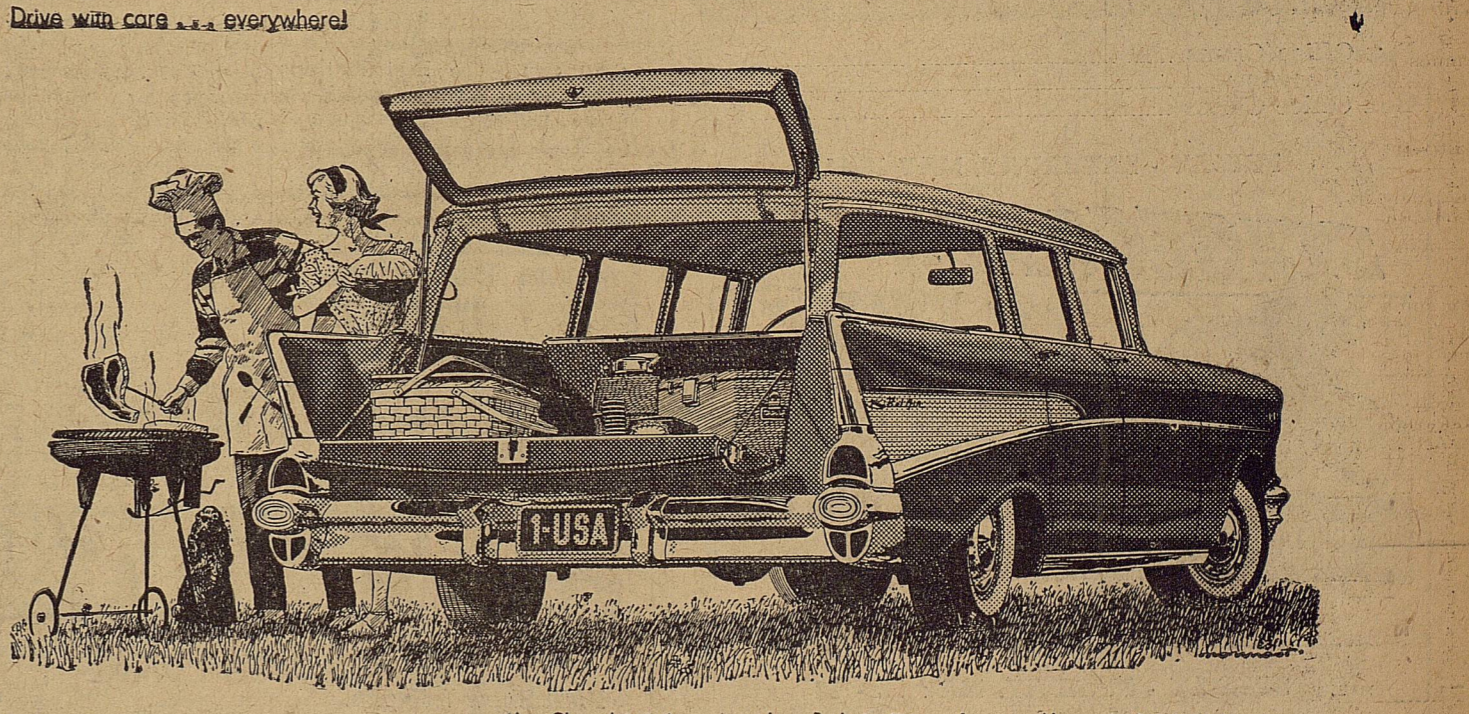

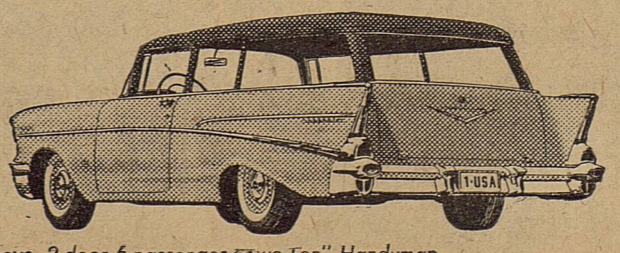
