

Oct. 5 through 13. The Junior show follows during the second week of the Fair, Oct. 14-19. There will be horse shows all three weekends of the Fair.



1. An Act empowering the Board of Insurance Commissioner: of the State of Texas to require insurance companies doing business in the State of Texas to make and publish a statement of their financial condition at least twice each year upon call of the Board of Insurance Commissioners of the State of Texas; providing a penalty; and declaring an emergency.

2. An Act providing that any officer of any insurance company organized under the laws of the State of Texas who shall file with the Board of Insurance Commis sioners any false information on any person who shall execute or cause to be executed and false statement shall be guilty of a felony; providing a penalty therefore; and declaring an emergency.

3. An Act requiring publication of certain information appearing on each application for the purchase of land under the Texas Veterans' Land Act.

4. An Act requiring publication of the full text of all ordinances of incorporated cities and towns, including home rule cities, which are required by statute to be published in any form; repealing conflicting laws,

5. An Act providing that state, county and other officials who refuse to permit the public examination of records except those designated by law as not open to public inspection shall be guilty of a misdemeanor; providing penalty therefor; providing for the removal of such officials. 6. An Act establishing venue for the indictment and prosecution of offenses involving public funds or property; providing this Act (Continued on Page 2)
