





Hot Weather Hints Given By **Safety Council**

"HOT WEATHER HINTS" College Station,—The 'good old summertime' is here and with it comes highest temperatures and bright sunlight. The Texas Farm and Ranch Safety Council warns that too much sunlight and over-

exposure to high temperatures can cause troubles unless precautions are taken.

They point out that heat sickness will occur when the body's heat regulating system collapses during prolonged heat or overexposure to the sun. In sunstroke, body temperature rises, the skin becomes hot and dry, face reddens and a shooting headache develops. Heat exhaustion is an entirely different thing. Its symptoms are below normal body temperature, cold clammy skin, palor, dizziness and

The Council offers the following suggestions for preventing summertime troubles caused by heat. Avoid overexposure to direct sunlight and wear a hat while out-ofdoors; avoid overexertion; wear light, porous and loose fitting clothing; increase the use of salt in food and use salt tablets or salt in drinking water; drink plenty of water during the day but avoid ice water and alcohol; eat nutritious food but don't overeat; drink fruit juices or eat fresh fruit for a plentiful supply of Vitamin C and get plenty of rest and bathe regularly.

The Council offers this simple rule if first aid treatment must be given to a person suffering from heat sickness. If the patient is cold, make him warm; if he is hot, make him cool.



POTATO AND CORN CHOWDER WITH SAUSAGE DUMPLINGS

3 large Washington State Long milk

White potatoes 3 large onions

1 (No. 2) can cream style corn 1 pound country style pork

1½ tsps. salt
3 thes. butter or margarine ½ cup dry bread crumbs Peel and slice potatoes. Skin and chop onions. Put in medium sized kettle and add enough water to cover. Add salt and cook until potatoes are tender (about 15 minutes). Meanwhile, combine sausage with bread crumbs and shape into small balls. Fry until browned on all sides and cooked through. Put potatoes through ricer or strainer. Add butter, corn, enough milk to make desired consistency and add meat balls; heat through. Season with additional salt and pepper if needed. Makes 4 to 6 servings.


