Southern Juries No Good? Here's A Prize Northern Jury

Backers of Civil Rights legislation in Washington, from the President on down, say they must do away with the right of trial by jury in the enforcement of Civil Rights FOR RENT: House, partly furbecause no jury in the South would convict a man charged with violating them.

Well, let's take a look at a jury that has just returned a verdict in the James R. Hoffa case—a "Northern" jury, mind you, that can do no wrong.

Hoffa, a Teamsters Union big-wig, who was being tried on a charge that he had conspired and bribed to plant a spy within the Senates Rackets Committee to keep him posted as to what was going on, was acquitted by this socalled jury.

If there ever was an air-tight case against a man, they thought they had it against Hoffa. Some 30 or 40 witnesses of the highest repute testified that he had really conspired with a lawyer for him to obtain a position of trust with the Rackets Committee and to tell him (Hoffa) everything that went on relating to the Teamsters Union and Hoffa's shady dealings—to keep him tipped off in advance so that he could be prepared for anything that might come up.

Indeed, they even found on Hoffa's person certain communications from his spy disclosing secrets of the Rackets Committee. This, alone, was enough to sew up the case air tight.

It so happened there were eight Negroes on this jury, some of them Negro women.

What did Hoffa's defense attorneys do? They brought in several Negro attorneys to sit with them at the council table, although the Negroes took no part in the proceed-

Then to cap the climax, they had former world's heavyweight champion Joe Lewis march into court during the middle of the proceedings. Lewis announced that he had come to see what was happening to "my good friend

After that, when the eight Negro jurors and four white men got the case, they turned Hoffa loose in a record





HERE'S HOW STATE DIVIDES ESTATES WHEN THERE IS NO

The death of an intestate person (one who has made no will) may give rise to many problems regarding distribution of his separate estate. In the preceding column we investigated the man ner of dividing the community estate upon the death of a husband r wife. Now we shall see that, where separate property is involed, a completely different set of ules applies in determining heirhip and apportioning the estate among the rightful claimants.

It may be well to recall that the eparate estate of a husband or vife includes property owned by either before marriage, and that which is acquired after marriage by gift or inheritance. Any other property acquired after marriage is presumed by law to be communty property until the contrary clearly proved.

Now, here is a general idea as to how your separate property will be divided if you do not make a will with contrary provisions prior to your death.

If your husband or wife survives and if, in addition, there are surviving children or descendants of previously deceased children, the chldren and their descendants immediately obtain a full (fee) title in two-thirds of the real estate involved. The surviving spouse receives a life interest in the renaining one-third of the real property, which passes on to the hildren and their descendants ipon the death of the spouse.

The rule for distributing per sonal property - - cash, stock, bonds, furniture, or any other FOR SALE: New, used and worn items not constituting real estate is different. Here the surviving pouse gets full ownership of one third, and the children and their lescendants inherit the balance.

Now suppose your husband or vife survives, but there are no surviving children or their descendants. In this case the surviving pouse inherits all of the personal property involved.

With regard to real estate, the urvivor obtains full title to one alf, and the other half is dividd between your mother and fat her, if both survive you. If only one of them survives, he or she receives only half of his portion, and the other (or one-fourth of the real estate) will be divided room house. A. W. 



Colorado River basin, \$2,700,-1

Guadalupe-San Antonio river pasin, \$10,300,000.

"Here is part of the other side of the picture," the Senator added. "Except for the flood control projects we have built on the Triny River, damage in that river pasin would have been \$81,000,-000 more than it actually was.

"Property owners in the Brazos River basin were hard hit. But their losses would have been \$26,-000,000 greater if we had not built some dams. 

Canned Meats Grace Breakfast



Canned meats so associated with luncheon and dinner menus provide variety and heartiness at breakfast too. For example, everpopular corned beef hash may be topped with baked or poached eggs. Pork sausage, canned in link, bulk and patty styles, makes a fine team with plain or blueberry pancakes. And scrambled eggs are the better for an addition of spicy deviled ham.

The 12-ounce loaf of luncheon meat, and the 12-ounce packs of beef, yeal and chopped ham may be sliced and pan-broiled as breakfast meats.

Baked Hash 'n' Eggs I can (1 pound) corned beef hash

Divide corned beef hash into 4 individual baking dishes. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) 20 minutes. Make a depression in hash for eggs. Break an egg into each dish. Sprinkle lightly with salt and pepper. Continue baking until eggs are set, about 12 minutes. YIELD: 4 servings.

Party Scrambled Ham 'n' Eggs ½ teaspoon salt ¼ teaspoon Tabasco 4 tablespoons (½ stick) butter Paprika 2 small cans (24 ounces each)

Break eggs into large mixing bowl. Add milk, deviled ham, salt and Tabasco; beat with rotary beater until foamy. Melt butter in chafing dish or large skillet; pour in egg mixture. Cook over medium heat, stirring from bottom and sides as eggs become firm, Continue until eggs are thick and creamy. To serve, sprinkle with paprika. YIELD: 6 servings.








Pickle Liver Ribbon Sandwiches (About 4 dozen sandwiches)

to R. P. Phillips, release of deed One 41/2 - ounce can liver spread, 1 tablespoon finely chopped onion, 1/4 teaspoon sage, to R. P. Phillips, extension of 1/4 cup drained sweet pickle relish, 1 tablespoon chili sauce, 2 slices crisp cooked bacon, crumbled, salt to taste, 20 slices white

Combine liver spread, onion, sage, pickle relish, chili sauce and bacon; mix well. Season with salt and chill. Trim crusts from bread and spread 15 slices with liver spread mixture. Put 3 slices bread together to make 5 sandwiches. Top with remaining 5 slices bread. Wrap tightly in waxed paper and chill. Cut into 1/4-inch slices to serve.

Egg and Dill Pickle Spread (About 2 cups spread)

Four hard-cooked eggs, chopped, 1/4 cup chopped green pepper, 34 cup chopped dill pickles. 1/4 cup mayonnaise. 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon chopped onion. Combine all ingredients. Mix well and chill. Spread on buttered bread or rolls, as desired.






