contacted by the Bailey County
Sheriff's office on Thursday, but

horses were discovered in a ditch
near Muleshoe.
Following an autopsy at the
Muleshoe Animal Clinic, Ms.
Gallagher said the charges were
filed on recommendation of the
veterinarian who did the autopsy
on the animals.
According to the autopsy
report, the animals had starved
to denth, said Ms. Gallagher.
The Humane Society officials
said the local sheriffs office
reported receiving several calls
about the horses during the last
three weeks, prompting the call
to the Humane Society to conduct
the investigation.
The charges. against Bruns
constitute a .Class A Mis-
demeanor' covered by Section
d2.11 and carries a penalty as
follows:
A fine not to exceed $\$ 2000 ;$ or
confinement in jail for a term not
to exceed one year; or both fine
and imprisonment.
Also, according to state law,
within ten days a hearing will be held on the courthouse steps said Ms. Gallagher, and the
