year advertising the "virtues" of their wares. If one were to pay attention to their lying and deceitful advertising one would get the idea that with Booze lies the keys to the Kingdom, but the truth of the matter is that the only keys King Booze commands are those to the casket.

The American public gets a dose of awful beer advertising on TV and radio that is sickening enough to make one reach for the vomitorium so one can retch. I get so tired of hearing beer ads my self that I sometimes cut the squawkbox off and go to bed without the news in order to escape the torture of having to listen to some idiot, who doesn't know better, having the advantages of beer.

All beer is good for is a couple of belches, and then you've had it. For a summertime cooling drink beer can't begin to touch the practicality of a good lemonade or a limeade. The two fruits have something in them that hit the summer thirst a blow to the solar plexus.

In addition to the 9 to 11 billions spent on drinking alcohol in this country there are a lot of other costs arising from its use that we haven't taken into consideration.

In the State of Texas, for example, it is estimated that for ever dollar collected in taxes on beverage alcohol the state is out another \$53 in expenses brought on by the use of alcohol. This does not take into consideration the tremendous cost in wrecked and misspent lives caused by hard drink and the time and talent lost by people affected by this dread disease.

People all over our land serve liquor in their homes for social gatherings and think they are being smart in doing so. But to one person in about 28 alcohol is as poisonous as a rattlesnake bite. But if you and I had a dog who bit one person in 28 who passed our house each day the authorities would have us put the poor animal out of his misery why should the whiskey boys ask for special consideration for their product.

The end product of social drinking is the alcoholic. There are about 4 and a half million of these in our land today, with the percentage on a population basis growing with each passing day. Then, too, in addition to the 4 and a half million poor devils who constantly cry for more brain-number there are about 14,000,000 problem drinkers in the land. There are people who occasionally hit the fire-juice a little too hard and have to take time off from work to recover from their aches and hanger pains.

In 1953—according to Yale University—our national consumption of liquor was 18.95 gallons of the stuff per person. Man alive!! What a drunk!! What a headache!!

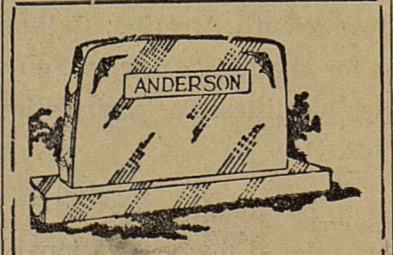
Christian Science

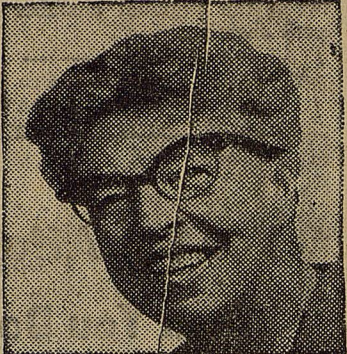

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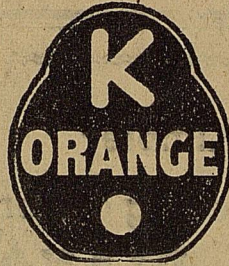

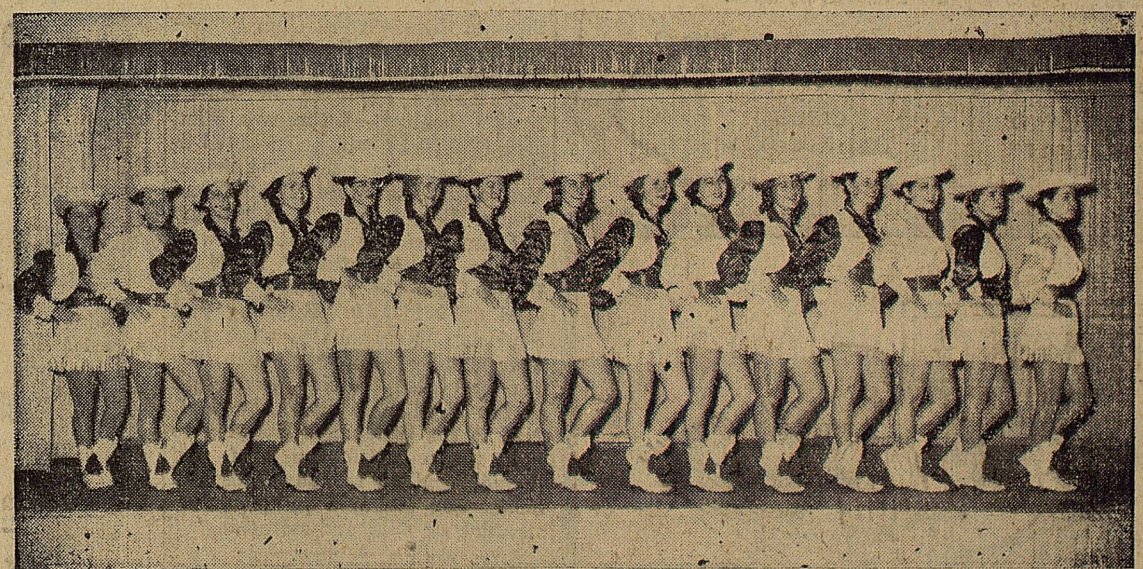
