Oil Business Returns To County -- Studded With Stars

Barnes, E-1 prolific producer in the Danley-Barnes lease, 5 miles NW of Ranger. The lease now contains 8 producers, with 12 other producers also owned by the oil firm.

The well has 2150 ft. of pay, producing from the Duffer and Mississippi areas, with no salt water. E.W. Griffin, land man for the firm, said the well has a value of \$5,000 per acre ft., and an over-all value of nearly \$3,000,000.

The drilling firm is moving its offices to the 5th floor of the Exchange Building, or about July 25, and will move to Eastland Executive vice president, Walter Thompson, of Hazlehurst, Ga., Wayne Dodson, petroleum engineer, Colorado City; Recently moving to Westland are James Powers, vice president in charge of operations and field management; Wayne Taggart, of Moran is ass't to the president. E.W. Griffin, of Olden, is in charge of the land and leasing department.

Offices in the Exchange building will house the engineering office and conference room space for the firm's accounting officer, offices for the leasing department, and space for four secretaries.

Sport-minded readers will remember John R. Shaw when he wrestled professionally as "Ivan the Terrible" for several years. Other Hollywood personalities who have a financial interest in the Danley-Barnes lease include Western Star Denver Pyle, and "heavy Mike Mazurki" (himself a former wrestler), as well as Eddie Albert and others. Announcement was made recently of another new major business for Eastland.

John R. Shaw, president of John R. Shaw & Assoc., of Moran, Texas, announced that his firm will move his engineering and field offices to Eastland within 10 days.

Offices will be located on the fifth floor of the Exchange building. Building officials are presently paneling, carpeting, and remodeling the space to be occupied.

Shaw, who once wrestled under the name of "Ivan The Terrible", said that the office space will include a conference room, engineering office, space for the firm's accountant, leasing department, and secretaries.

Moving to Eastland will be Walter Thompson, exec v.p., of Hazlehurst, Georgia. In addition to his other duties, Thompson will handle the company's brokerage. Also, James Powers, Eastland, who will be vice president in charge of operations and field management.

Wayne Dodson, the firm's petroleum engineer will move from Colorado City to Eastland. Other officers of the firm include Wayne Taggart, of Moran, ass't to the president, and E.W. Bud Griffin, of Olden, who will be in charge of the land and leasing department.

Shaw said that in the near future the firm would move its drilling yard and shops to Eastland. Even though the firm owns leases and is drilling in other locations, its main field is the Danley-Barnes lease 6 miles n.w. of Ranger in the Griffin-Anderson reef between and 3600-4000 ft in the Mississippi and Ellenburger.

Shaw has backers in the movie industry, among them Denver Pyle and Mike Mazurki, Eddie Albert. Albert was in Eastland Saturday with Shaw to view the wells in the field that he has an interest in. The firm is presently seeking other leases in the Eastland & Stephens County area.

Water Line Break Repaired

A main water line near the Eastland County Water Supply plant broke sometime Sunday night causing a water shortage for some customers in Ranger and Eastland Monday, according to a report Wednesday morning.

The water line has been repaired, however, Water Supt. Jesse White has asked all water customers to be conservative in using water until the water supply can be built up. Over two million gallons of water per day is being used by both Ranger and Eastland.

Ranger, Cisco Junior Colleges To Offer Courses At Graham

Representatives of Ranger and Cisco Junior Colleges, along with members of the Chamber of Commerce Education Committee were on hand in Graham Wednesday evening to announce the initiation of college level courses in Graham, beginning this Fall.

Plans call for a registration session to be held August 28 at 6 p.m. in the Community room of the First National Bank in Graham, for persons interested in the courses to be offered by the two institutions.

Courses are to be offered both during the day and night.

Classes are to begin the week of September 4, and will most likely be held in available school rooms, or if necessary, in other buildings.

Courses to be offered by Cisco Junior College include math, geology, government, sociology, economics, introduction into business, art, Spanish and French.

Courses to be offered by Ranger Junior College include history, speech, psychology, accounting, agriculture, business law, foundations of health and English.

Also, other courses will be offered if there is sufficient demand. A minimum of 15 students is necessary.

Cost of courses is set by the state, with the rate of \$4 per hour and a minimum charge of \$25.

Due to quirk in the law, it was noted that if a person took one course from one school and another offered by another school, he would have to pay a total of \$50, \$25 to each school.

However Mrs. Emma Watts, Cisco business manager, said that to attend Cisco and take six hours, it would cost a students \$57 in fees.

Besides the tuition, a nominal charge for building use will probably be included. It was estimated it would probably be in the neighborhood of \$1.50 per hour for the cost of utilities, janitorial services, etc.

Again, it was stressed that it would still be less than what it would cost students on either campus, because students in Graham would not be subject to any bounded indebtedness that is charged to students on the two campuses.

Plans as yet are uncertain but for at least the first semester, instructors and other personnel will be committing from the two junior colleges.

On hand to make the announcement from Ranger Junior College was the

President of Ranger, Dr. Jack Elson. From Cisco Junior College were Dr. Leland Willis, president; Mrs. Emma Watts, business manager, and Carrol Scott, dean.

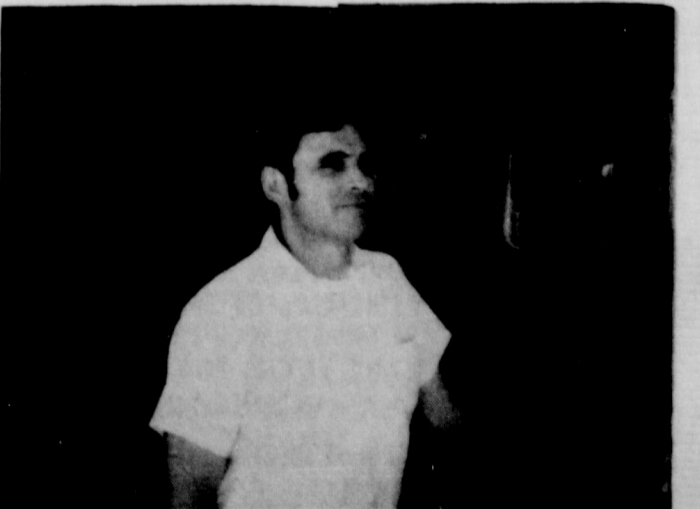
In a press conference, it was revealed that application by the two schools was made on February 14 to the State Coordinating Board to conduct classes in Graham. Approval was granted during an April board meeting.

The Board designated Graham an Extension Center for Cisco and Ranger Junior Colleges.

Last year, a measure to establish a junior college district for tax purposes to finance a junior college in Graham was overwhelmingly defeated. This measure to bring junior college courses to Graham is not connected with that matter in any way, it was explained.

Plans call for students to have the same use of the facilities located on the two campuses as the students located on them. The state is to help the two colleges involved by paying the instructors teaching fees.

Also provided, will be counseling services and other things that will expose students to the resources of the two institutions.

Crusade Begins Sunday

Crusade Chairman, Richard Watson of Eastland reports that progress and cooperation have been tremendous in preparing for this encounter with Christ. Committee workers in the individual churches have worked diligently on their assigned tasks, and things are running smoothly for the opening of the crusade.

The culmination of several months of planning, organization, preparation, and prayer will be evident this next week with the start of the "Meet Jesus Crusade" on Sunday evening, July 29 at 8 p.m. in Eastland's Maverick Stadium. The crusade, sponsored by the Cisco Baptist Association, will continue with services each night at 8 p.m. through Friday night, August 3.

Evangelist for the week-long series of services will be Ben Loring, Jr., of Houston. Ben is a graduate of Baylor University and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. He pastored churches in Mart and Eddy during his college years and served as a BSU summer missionary to Singapore. He served as minister of evangelism for the First Baptist Church, Houston, from 1970-72. He is now with the Christian Life Commission of the Baptist General Convention of Texas. He leads in conferences at local Baptist churches, associations, and on many college campuses. He has had evangelistic ministry in over 200 churches.

Bro. Loring, the son of Reverend Ben Loring, Sr., of Garland, is married and has two children. His home church is Cliff Temple Baptist Church of Dallas.

Connie Ware of North Carolina will be the music evangelist of the crusade. He is a native Texan and is the son of J.W. Ware, long-time Baptist minister. After high school graduation, where he was an outstanding athlete, Connie attended Baylor University and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, receiving degrees in church music. During his college years he began leading in youth revivals and in 1969 he worked with Dr. Chester Swor in a series of revivals. He comes to us with experiences in more than 100 revivals and crusades. Connie serving as music and

youth minister at the First Baptist Church of Waynesville, North Carolina, recently entered full-time evangelistic music.

The 100 voice Crusade choir, under the direction of Connie Ware, along with others, will be providing inspiring special music each night. Volunteer response for the choir has been good, according to Emmett Carson, crusade music committee chairman. JoAnn Baker of Eastland will be pianist and James Steel of Rising Star organist for the Crusade. The choir will rehearse for an hour each night preceding the Crusade services. Choir members are asked to be in place at 7 p.m. each evening.

Ushers are being provided on a volunteer basis from participating area churches. Ushers will be positioned at vantage points in Maverick Stadium to assist in seating etc.

An attendance goal of 1500 persons each night of the crusade has been set.

The Eastland Fire Department will direct traffic and parking at the stadium parking lots.

Nursery facilities will be provided at the First Baptist Church in Eastland for all children, ages birth to three years. Parents are asked to contact their local Baptist churches to find out if local nursery arrangements have been made. It not, the Eastland facilities will be available.

A large number of counselors from various area towns have been attending training sessions in preparation for their duties during the Crusade. A counselor training session is set for Friday night, July 27 at 7 p.m. at the East Cisco Baptist Church in Cisco, and another counselor's meeting Saturday night, July 28, at the Eastland Stadium beginning at 6:30 p.m.

This session will precede "Dedication Night" activities which begin on Saturday night, July 28 with the choir rehearsal at 7:30 p.m. and the Dedication Rally at 8 p.m. This service will serve as "kick-off" for the Crusade at which time the evangelist and music evangelist will both be present and participating in the service.

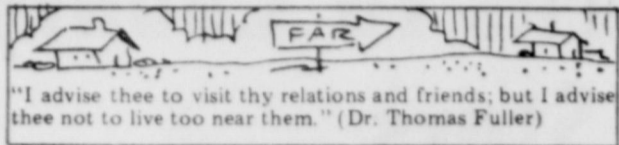

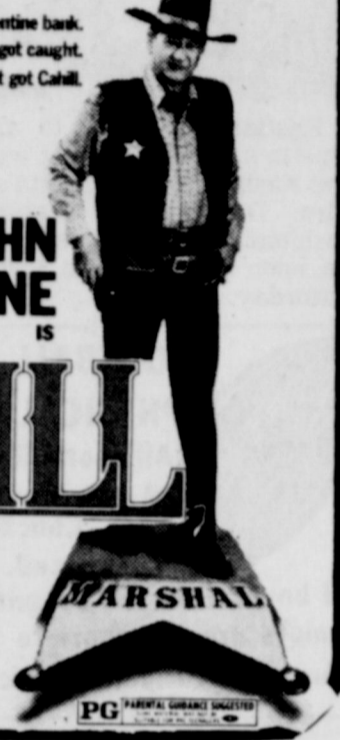


