Farm Safety Week **Proclaimed in County**

PROCLAMATION BY THE County Judge of Eastland County TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL Eastland County by County

I, Scott Bailey, County Judge of Eastland County, do hereby declare the week of July 25- 31, 1973 as FARM AND RANCH SAFETY WEEK in Eastland County. for the following reasons:

WHEREAS, the blessing of technological progress in agriculture have given the farmers and rancher of our county the ability to produce and abundance of food and fiber, adding to their economic

well- being and comforts of life; and WHEREAS, the implements of modern agricultural techonolgy have also added the risk of accidents ormishaps on the farm or ranch, on public

roads, in the home, or in recreational activities; and WHEREAS, farm and ranch accidents continue to account for approximately 200 deaths and thousands of painful disabling injuries each year in Texas, in addition to the money cost; and

WHEREAS, during this week, a statewide farm accident prevention education program will be undertaken by the Texas Farm Bureau, the Texas Farm and Ranch Safety Council, the Texas Safety Association, the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas 4- H ClubsTexas Future Farmer and Future Homemakers of America, Young Farmers andYoungHomemakers of Texas and the Eastland County Farm Bureau with the theme, "Falls Hurt ...-Be Alert... at work, at home, and at play. The educational campaign also includes " HAND SIGNALS FOR AGRICULTURE; and

WHEREAS, experience has shown that legislation does not solve all of our problems, especially in the field of safety so we must continue to rely on caution, common sense, skill, protective equipment and the knowledge that we receive from our educational programs to counter the many hazards and keep accidents and injuries to a minimum;

THEREFORE, I urge all citizens to recognize this special period, and especially urge farm families of Eastland County to become more safety conscious, not only during Farm Safety Week, but to utilize the monthly emphasis topics and program guides to help make farm safety a round- the- calendar activity.

The week of July 25- 31, 1973 has been proclaimed as Farm and Ranch Safety Week in Judge Scott Bailey, at the request of Jack Cozart, Eastland County Farm Bureau President. The local farm orginazation is joining efforts with other farm and ranch agencies to coordinate the special farm safety, campaign within the county.

In this proclamation, Judge Bailey said"I urge all citizens to recognize this special period, and especially urge farm families of the Eastland County to become more safety conscious, not only during FARMSAFETY WEEK, but to utilize the monthly emphasis topics and program guides to help make farm safety a round- the- calendar activity."

Reviewing the National Safety Council's materials, which include hand signals for agriculture, Farm Burea P Bureau President Jack Cozart said "hand signals can save time and prevent accid dentseven fatal accidents. They are especially useful when noise or distance makes voice communication difficult or impossible. It is important for these sigignals to be widely publicized and learned so both sender and receiver will un-

The Texas Farm Bureau Safety Department has tabulated the 1972 Farm Fatalities, which total 183 deaths coccurring in 105 Texas counties. The breakdown is as follows: firemans & drownings 321 each; fires & burns,- 30; tractors- 25; falls- 18; machinery - 12; electric current- 9; suffocation- 8; struck by object- 6; run over by auto- 3; animals- 3; poisoning & tetnus- 2; snakebite- 2; unknown- 2; and lightning- 1







Tractors Can Be Safe

can be prevented, according to the National Safety Council.

The Safety Council estimates that there are from 800 to 1,000 deaths resulting annually from tractor accidents. In addition, thousands are injured and millions of dollars are lost in property damage, medical costs, time off work, lost earning power and insurance costs.

"Most of these losses could be prevented," stated the Safety Council, "by competent operation of tractors, use of protective equipment and proper maintenance."

More than half of all tractor accident fatalities involve overturns, the Council reports. These fatalities occur unnecessarily, because the equipment to protect the driver in a rollover is available for new tractors and many older models.

partment. "The problem," said the Council official, "is that many farmers and ranchers are reluctant to invest in roll-over protection systems for their equipment. The Safety Council, however, believes that the use of ROPS is essential to preventing unnecessary tractor accident injuries and fatalities."

Tractor operation can be safe if operators are alert to potential accident hazards. The Safety Council offers the following 10 tips for safer operation of the tractor on the farm or ranch:

-Stay clear of ditches, embankments, holes, etc., to avoid out of gear, firmly set brakes

-Don't permit others to ride - keep children off and

-Cut speed when turning, 90 percent of the roll-over fa- crossing slopes, on rough,

and avoid obstacles, and be sure everyone is clear before

-Stay off hills and slopes too steep for safe operation.

-Don't overload - engage clutch slowly with heavy load to avoid backward tip.

-Hitch loads only to drawbar (if drawbar is on 3-point hitch, set it no higher than fixed drawbar) - use front weights to balance tractor.

-Keep PTO shields in place -shut off PTO before unclogging, adjusting or servicing equipment.

-Set wheels wide as practical for job for better stability. -When stopped, put tractor

and/or use park lock-remove





The habit of opening refrigerator and freezer doors only when it's really necessary is a saving habit. The cold air that rushes out each time has to be replaced, which causes the unit to run more and use more electricity. The studies made by extension services and local volunteers show that an estimated 169,000 injuries occur annually to farm residents, workers and visitors in the states studied. > The survey area contained approximately 825,000 farms with more than 3 million farm residents. The results indicate that nearly two-thirds of the total injuries were work-related. and much of the remainder occurred during periods of leisure activity.


