

#### County Among 190 With Excess Of \$100,000 Oil, Gas

The petroleum industry in Eastland County played a significant role in 1972 in helping to satisfy the unprecedented demand for Texas' crude oil and natural gas.

Eastland was one of 190 of Texas' 254 counties which produced oil and gas valued in excess of \$100,000 in recorrd production year for the states No. 1 industry, according to figures compiled by the Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association.
