We're not about to run out, but inexpensive energy is a thing of the past."

That's the word from Martha Harmon, Consumer Affairs Director for Lone Star Gas Co., speaking in Eastland this week.



The planning and construction of a lignite-fueled power plant like the one pictured here takes just about that long.

That's at least eight years to locate and purchase the right site, order equipment, plan and build the plant, obtain approvals from all regulatory agencies, and then test the plant's operation carefully.


