# Mavericks Shellac Bulldogs, 36-0. Face DeLeon Here Next Friday

went on a rampage in Bulldog Stadium Friday night to defeat the Ranger Bulldogs 36 to 0 in a non - conference grid match.

The Mays received the opening kick - off to score on their first play of the game on a 67 yard scamper by tailback Tony Thomas for the first touchdown of the evening for the Big Red. Thomas took the ball from quarterback John Jiminez on the May 34 yard line Puried Saturday and hit the middle of the Bulldog line like a Sherman p.m. tank and found running room to be credited with the longest run of the night for the Mavs. Thomas again took the ball from Jiminez and hit the right side of the line for two extra points to give the Mays a quick 8 - 0 lead.

The Bulldogs took possession of the ball on their 33 yard line and moved down to the Mav's 8 before losing the ball on an attempted screen pass.

That's what it took to land Bob the strategic position as one of General Electric's "three TV pioneers" assigned to put WRGB on the air and broadcast spradic programming to the twelve G.E. officials with television sets.

Not satisfied as an accountant with G.E., he applied for the job. "I wanted something with more action and challenge than juggling figures behind a desk," recalls Bob, Programming Director for WBAP - TV (NBC). "There was a manager, an announcer and me. I really got the job because the manager needed a secretary who could take shorthand.'

The early work at Schenectady, N.Y., consisted of experiments in lighting, cameras and programs. And there was a big question mark: What will this new media produce?

Since then, the industry and Bob have come a long way together. For Bob, it included a side trip to blow up the Long Island Railroad. He also took time out to give a hand to a struggling college kid. His name was Pat Boone.

World War II presented Bob with a new employer. Photo Mate Robert J. Gould, U.S. Navy, was assigned to the Photo Science Lab, Washington, D.C. His commanding officer was actor Gene Kelly.

And since there were no live cameras aboard the U.S. submarine that blew up a Japanese railroad, Bob and other members of Commander Kelly's staff, all from Hollywood except Bob, were given the job of recreating the moment in history. The Long Island Railroad at Montouk Point was the place selected. The railroad cooperated beautifully since it was in the interest of pictorial science. That film was later seen by millions of viewers of "Silent Service" on NBC - TV.

V - J Day sent Bob back to Schenectady and WRGB, now engaged in advanved pioneer work in

A new industry was having growing pains. And anyone with experience could take his pick. "I chose Fort Worth because it was the only place I could imagine with as much wide open space as Cutbank, Montana", where Bob grew up on his father's Lazy Y4 Ranch.

Production Manager was the title. WBAP - TV was the station, the first in the southwest.

Bob's debut as an executive was marred by a traffic accident. The first evening of scheduled programming, September 29, 1948, included an 18 minute blackout caused by a truck crashing into a utility pole and cutting off the station's power. Nonetheless, the "opening night" was a success. The main attraction was Alexander Korda's "The Scarlet Pimpernel"

Downtown department stores served refreshments as thousands got their first look at instantly projected sight and sound. Programming was 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Wednesday through Sunday and consisted of such regulars as The Flying X Ranch Boys and wrestling matches.

There was also a regular feature called "Barn Dance". The MC was Pat Boone, then a student at North Texas State University at nearby Denton.

Bob gained his present title six months after he joined WBAP - TV, but his tasks multiplied. He put on the first weather show in television. "Nobody thought it would have much of an audience",, he laughs. He also pioneered football for the area. And he was there with the first live color telecast in

Despite his long association with the industry, Bob is the one man at WBAP - TV who refuses to step in front of a camera.

On and off the job, he combines diplomacy and a natural fondness for people and conversation on almost any subject. Away from work, Bob and his wife Evelyn - his high school sweetheart - take pride in his stock of riding horses. Son Jim is married and father of Bob's grandson. Daughter Janice is the mother of his granddaughter.

Despite all the firsts that have been sprinkled throughout his career, the Kennedy Assassination Story was the most dramatic. "It was the greatest combined effort TV has made since I've been in the business.'

A lot has happened to Bob Gould in the last 25 years. He says, "The industry will go just as far in the next 25, too. But today, the man behind the camera is a college graduate and an engineer. The opportunity is still there for the young man interested in a dynamic force on the move, but it takes more than a shorthand pad and a knowledge of home





grown with inadequate amounts of plant nutrients.

Many producers apply potash which improves the

topdressing in the spring but do not consider other nutrients that small grain crops may need.

Small grains are very responsive to phosphorus and only a soil test can determine the amount to apply. Phosphorus stimulates rapid. early growth which is especially important in the crops are to be grazed. Phosphorus should be drilled at planting or broadcast and worked into the soil prior to seeding

Some fields may also need standing ability of plants.

However, this plant nutrient is generally not needed as often as nitrogen and phosphorus.

A soil test is the best guide to a sound fertilization program for small grains. Soil samples may be submitted to soil testing laboratories run by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service at College Station, Lubbock and Seymour.

Information sheets and instructions for collecting and mailing soil samples are available at the County Extension office.

DESIGNATING EMPLOYEES ENTITLED TO ADMINISTER ORDINANCE

Texas has in House Bill 1181 declared certain junked vehicles to be a public nuisance, and

WHEREAS, the City

with the provisions set out in Section 10 of such Bill desires to enact an ordinance establishing procedures for the abatement and removal of junked vehicles or parts thereof, as public nuisances, from private property or public property;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF

Section 1. Notice. That notice stating the nature of the public nuisance shall be given by certified or registered mail with a 5 day return requested to the owner or the occupant of the premises whereupon such public nuisance exists. That such notice shall also state that such public nuisance must be removed and abated within 10 days of receipt of such notice and that any request for a public hearing thereon must be made before the expiration of such 10 day period. That if the fice, official action to abate said nuisance shall be continued to a date not less than 10 days from the date of such

Section 3. Notice to Texas Highway Department. That notice shall be given to the Texas Highway Department within 5 days after the date of removal of the vehicle or part thereof identifying the vehicle or part thereof in order that said Department can cancel the certificate of title to such

Section 4. Employees Entitled to Administer Ordinance. That this ordinance may be administered by any regularly salaried, full time employees of the City of Eastland, except that the removal of the vehicle or parts thereof from property may be by any other duly authorized person.

Section 5. Nonapplicability of Ordinance. That this ordinanceshall not apply to (1) a vehicle or part thereof which is completely enclosed within a building in a lawful manner where it is not visible from the
