\$215,000 Bond Vote To Be Considered Monday Night

The Eastland City Commission will hold a special called meeting Monday at 7 p.m. at City Hall for the purpose of considering the calling of an election to issue bonds in the amount of \$215,000 for construction of a library - community center, at the insistence of the committee members.

Friday afternoon the Commission heard Marion Porter, Project Officer for the Soil Conservation Service, of Stephenville, explain the various federal aid programs available for such projects, one of which would be a two - thirds grant.

Mayor Durel Reid, chairman of the library - community center committee, and members of the committee present, asked that the proposal for a bond issue for the original \$215,000 building proposal, and without federal aid, be pursued.

Tuesday, Oct. 31 at the City Hall. Two voting boxes will be maintained: one for qualified voters with property on city tax rolls and the other for qualified voters without property on the city tax roll. In order to pass, the proposition must carry in the tax roll box and the sum of the two boxes must carry.

William Allen Leslie, son of the late Chief Justice and Mrs. William Pharmed Leslie, died of a heart attack in his home in Eastland, Texas, on October 6, 1972, at the age of 63 years.

This is a county - wide project, and we are striving to top last year's record where 61 Senior Citizens of Eastland County exhibited and earned over \$640 from their sales.

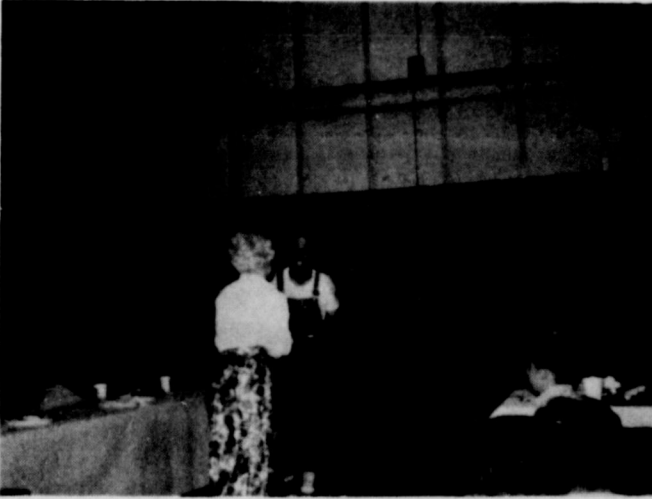
